

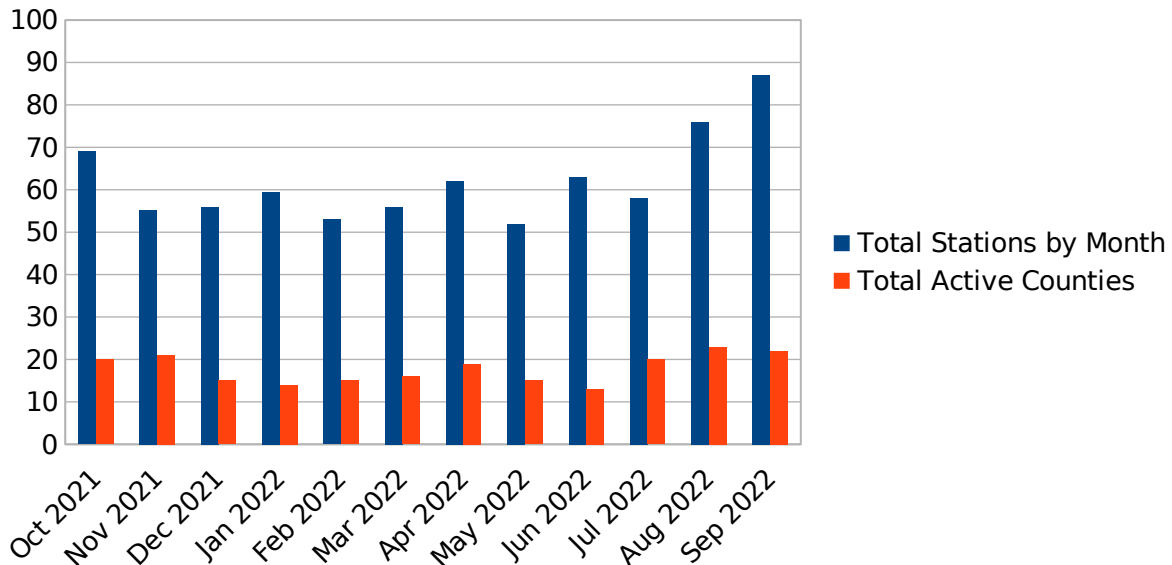

September, 2022 continued to experience an increase in OHDEN participation while the total number of Ohio participating counties remained flat.

The third session for the month experienced severe interference from a digital station but the stations under the leadership of W5UHQ as NCS kept the net on track.

One new station for Miami County, W8NJR, was added to the roster.

OHDEN called a net to session in support of the SET. The net was held after normal SET hours, 1900 to 2100hrs local, with the intent of moving the traffic onto Winlink for W8SGT. There were four messages handled.
