few comments about when I would get to it, I woke up one morning and set out to tackle it. Although it took most of the day and one trip to Home Depot, it was completed successfully. I would imagine some may feel the same way about radio projects they are putting off, especially if it is a part of the hobby you are not entirely comfortable with, or have never done before. But, if you push through, watch a few YouTube videos, and get it done, you will learn something new and will be more comfortable tackling something similar in the future. I did get to do one radio project which I tackled as soon as the part arrived. I ordered an Anderson Powerpole distribution

block so that I could easily power multiple devices from a single power source. That went in the shack easily and I can now switch between radios and power sources, like my Samlex power supply or a battery to test the remote rig. I also used Velcro to secure the block so that if needed, I can remove it and use on the go.

Looking forward to a New Year filled with Hamfests, POTA activations, Field Day, Fox Hunts, picnics, meetings, programs, and of course testing with many new licensed amateur radio operators.

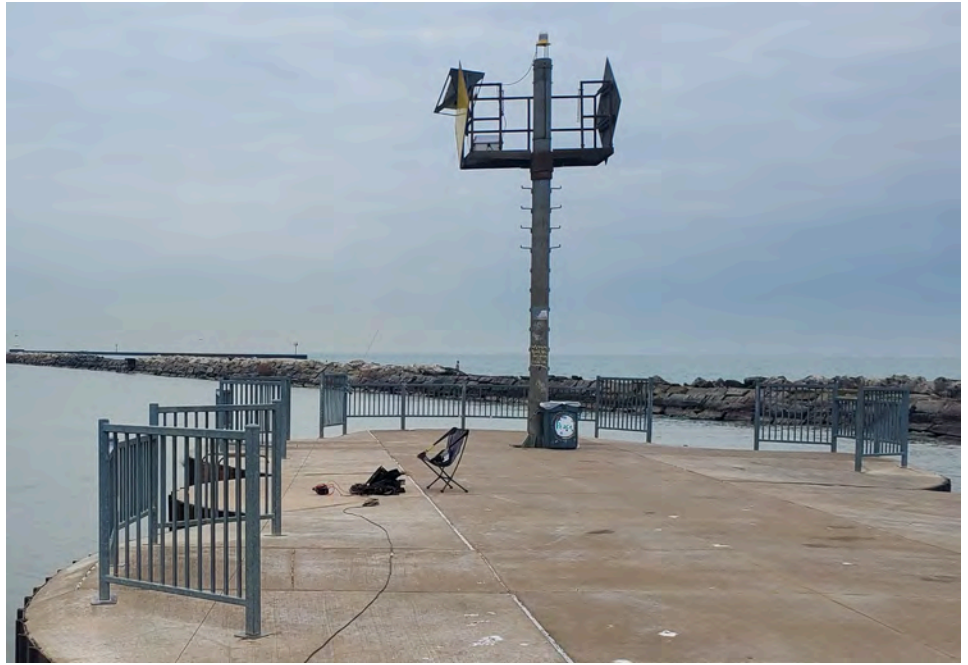

Seventeen of us enjoyed each other's company at the NOARS Tuesday Lunch in December. The January

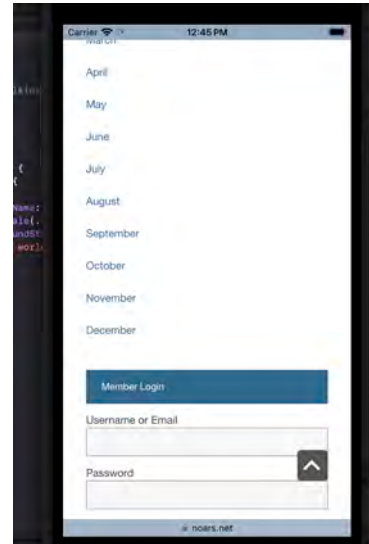
