Proposed Amendment to the Constitution of The Northern Ohio Amateur Radio Society

It is proposed that the Board of Directors section paragraph 1 be amended from the current:

“1. The principal governing body shall be a Board of Directors, consisting of the four current officers (President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer), plus the most recent past president and two (2) full members from the general membership, hereafter known by and referred to as the Directors.”

To this revised version, the changed text is highlighted:

“1. The principal governing body shall be a Board of Directors, consisting of the four current officers (President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer), plus the most recent past president and **three (3)** full members from the general membership, hereafter known by and referred to as the Directors.”

The first vote will be at the membership meeting on March 18.

The second vote will be at the membership meeting on April 15.

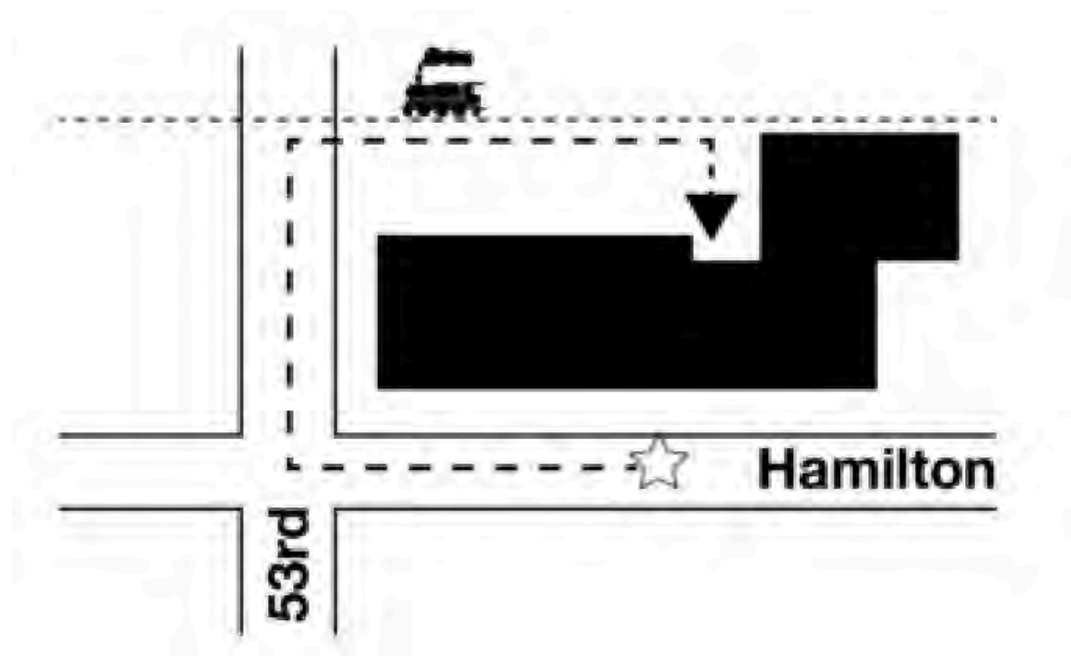
NOARS Makers' Event: Get Ready for Fox Hunt Season

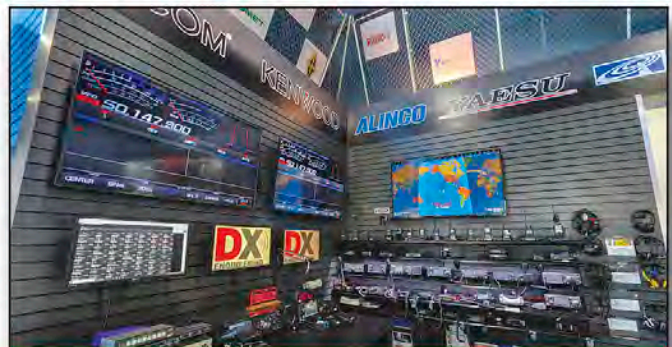

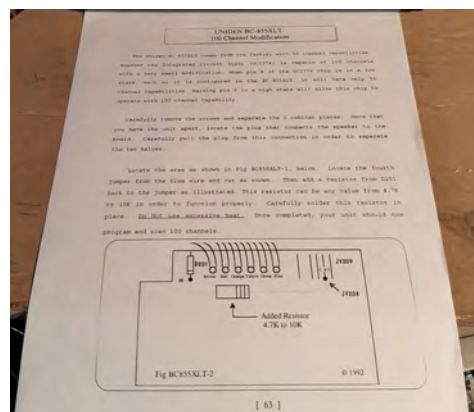

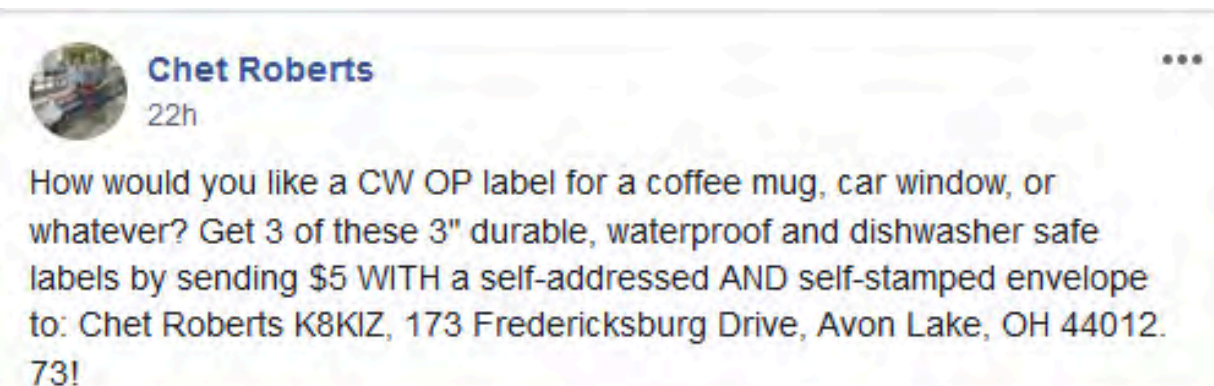
