HamVention is HERE!

The time has arrived.

In just a few days (May 17th through the 19th, for those of you who live under a rock) the HamVention will take place in Xenia, Ohio. Our "talk around" simplex frequency will be 147.420 MHz, 123.0 tone

For those new to amateur radio - welcome! This is the biggest such gathering in the world, and is YOUR opportunity to experience the following:

- See the latest communications equipment on the market and prototypes for the future;
- Talk with the manufacturers to better understand the radio you already have;
- Close-up examination of a variety of accessories you didn't know you need;
- Hear from a variety of speakers on wide-ranging topics;
- Meet and greet amateur radio operators from around the world;
- Purchase new and used equipment from dealers and flea market vendors;

Ask ANY questions you wish; you will (almost)* never hear someone say: "That's a stupid question!" *My stupid question was: "How many sandwiches will that big pork shop make?" Answer: "One."

QCEN will have a booth in the Flea Market oval; spaces 7543 through 7545, on Friday and Saturday ONLY. For this, we need your help on two counts: any equipment you might wish to sell, and an hour of your time to help staff the booth - no previous experience necessary.

On the equipment side: anything amateur, radio, or electronic related items - or something unusual. We sold a WWII era field typewriter one year; other odds and ends have been sold as well. For staffing the booth: we will have some early arrivals helping out, but if you get there before 0900, someone can escort you in ahead of time to help set things up. We will have two large canopies, multiple tables, and a lot of gear to put in

place. We can also use help during tear-down between 4 and 5pm each day.



If you want us to sell anything on your behalf (or for someone else), please bring it to our May meeting; if you are unable to do so, contact Bob, W8NFM at w8nfmusa@gmail.com (preferred) or via telephone/text at 513-550-1889 to make arrangements for equipment transfer. To help pay for our booth spaces (which cost us \$175.00) we charge 10% for the first \$300.00 for each item sold (i.e. item sells for \$20.00, QCEN keeps \$2.00; item sells for \$300.00 or more, QCEN fee maxes out at \$30.00) Once the \$175.00 booth spaces are covered, the rest goes into QCEN operations to

help us maintain and improve our equipment. In the last 15 years, we have NEVER lost money - so help keep that streak alive!

Special note: tickets are \$30.00 at the door; however, there will be at least four \$26.00 tickets for sale at the May meeting. As a final reminder: if you purchase something at the HamVention, but don't feel like dragging it around all day, we can hold the items at our flea market booth. Make your plans now to attend!
