
THE 2024 SOLAR ECLIPSE Through the Eyes of NASA

The path of the eclipse continues from Mexico, entering the United States in Texas, and traveling through Oklahoma, Arkansas, Missouri, Illinois, Kentucky, Indiana, Ohio, Pennsylvania, New York, Vermont, New Hampshire, and Maine.

Studying the Eclipse

As the total solar eclipse darkens a swath of North America when the Moon blocks the light of the Sun for a few minutes on Monday, April 8, scientists on and off the path of SunSketcher project will be used to determine the true shape of the Sun; the Dynamic Eclipse Broadcasting Initiative and Eclipse Megamovie are collecting video and images to measure how fast the material in the Sun's corona moves; and Citizen CATE 2024 is investigating how magnetic energy gets converted to heat in the Sun's Corona. totality will study the Sun's outer atmosphere, called the corona, and the eclipse's impact on Earth's atmosphere.

It is now an FCC requirement to have an FCC FRN; active email address and active phone number before taking any exam. Please bring your FCC FRN, original license, a copy of your license (if a licensed ham), a valid photo ID and \$15.00 - Cash preferred.



Effective April 19, 2022, the FCC will charge a \$35.00 application fee for amateur radio licenses. The fee will apply to new, renewal, rule waiver, and modification applications that request a new vanity call sign. License upgrades will not have a fee applied. The fee will be per application. *VE's <u>will not collect</u> the fees at exam sessions*.

The Lake County Amateur Radio Association is holding its **2024** Amateur Radio license exams at the **Kirtland Library**, 9267 Chillicothe Road, on the following dates:

This bi-monthly schedule is the first Saturday of every even-numbered month (e.g., February being the second month, etc.). They are held at the Kirtland Library, 9267 Chillicothe Road. It is 1.7 miles south of I-90 on Route 306 (Chillicothe Rd). The library is on the left, just beyond the Marathon gas station. The tests will start at **12 noon.** Please arrive a few minutes earlier.

To register, you will need a NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to complete one ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Googling "NCVEC quick-form 605" and clicking on the url for a pdf of the form. Please note **the FCC requires you to provide a FRN** (FCC Registration Number). Social Security Numbers are no longer accepted. If you are new to ham radio and don't have a FRN, Google "New FRN" and follow the fcc.gov link.

If you are currently licensed, be sure to **bring a copy of your license to the exam.** The cost of the exam itself is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. Identification with your picture is also necessary, such as a driver's license. If you have any questions, please contact Scott Farnham, KO8O, at (440) 256-0320, or scottfarnham@roadrunner.com

In addition to the \$15 test fee, the FCC now charges \$35 to add you to the Amateur Radio database. The FCC will e-mail successful candidates instructions for payment directly to them. Payment must be made within 10 days of the e-mail. This charge does not apply to upgrades.

We will start with two updates on the **FT4GL** DXPedition to **Glorioso Island**. FH4VVK, Marek, has announced that his FT4GL operation May 24-June 19 will include six meters, "propagation permitting." Glorioso Island is #8 on the Club Log DXCC Most Wanted List. More information is available on the FT4GL Facebook page and a newly launched blog. The Daily DX, and The Weekly DX will continue to carry updates as will I.

Secondly, F8CRS, Dave, will be the guest on an upcoming edition of the DX Mentor podcast and Youtube channel. Dave will discuss all aspects of the FT4GL DXpedition. If you need to get this in the log, you need to check out the DX Mentor.

We have some information from **Pitcairn Island, VP6G**. This is called the saga of the missing suitcase. PG5M, Gerben, plans to be on Pitcairn Island this month, operating as VP6G. He reported that one suitcase was missing upon arrival at Los Angeles International Airport. He hopes to be able to retrieve it in Papeete before leaving for Mangareta. If he is successful, he will be on the air April 4-14. He has posted expected transmit frequencies. His QSL manager is MØOXO, Charles. Visit his website for information about the station setup and VOACAP predictions by OH6BG. I hope he is QRV at the time you are with me.

YJ0VK is now QRV from **Vanuatu**. VK3HJ, Luke; VK6CQ, Alan; KØBBC, Matthew; and VK3QB, Chris ise on 40-6M through April 11. They are focusing on CW and SSB the first

week, with FT8 as their backup mode. On CW, they will run an Elecraft KX3 and SPE amplifier. For SSB, they will use an ICOM IC-7300 and 500W amplifier for SSB. Their third radio is an ICOM IC7000 for FT8, and their antennas are a DX Commander Expedition and 40M doublet. Their QSL manager is MØOXO, Charles; refer to their QRZ page for details.

E6SP, or "Echo 6 South Pacific," is the holiday-style call of ZL3GAV, Gavin, on **Niue**, April 16-28. He will have a Yaesu FTDX10 and a Chameleon MPAS2 vertical running up to 100W on all modes. He plans to emphasize FT8/FT4 on 15 and 10M. He also says that his antenna on 40M and below will be "compromised."

On SSB, he will start simplex, and if it gets busy, he will listen 5-10 KHz up. He may also operate SSTV. Gavin is hoping to work DXCC on 10M digital, confirming via LoTW. If he has a stable internet connection, he will use Club Log Live Stream and will upload QSOs to Club Log, as well as QRZ.com and LoTW. There will be no paper QSL cards.

We have an **IOTA** Update. Flinders Island (OC-261): A six-operator team is heading to Flinders Island, off the coast of Eyre Peninsula in South Australia. VK5FIL should be on the air April 14 by 0800 UTC. There will be four stations operating at the home base; a number of operators are bringing portable equipment for POTA activations. Requests for schedules, particularly for their satellite operation, can be emailed to vk5fil.dx@gmail.com. They will also be watching 6M TEP, Sporadic E (which is still proving active if this past week is an indication) and hopefully meteor scatter, as well as 2M-23CM for tropospheric contacts around Southern Australia. The usual VK VHF spotting networks will be activated to alert people to their VHF activity. Finally, the special callsign VI60IOTA will be activated for one day at some point during the trip to activate VKFF-1717. The DXpedition website has band plan information and propagation charts, the latter courtesy of the VOACAP team. They hope to use Club Log Live Stream.

HD8MD, Galapagos update. I had a great time operating from Galapagos as HD8MD over the last 9 days. Running only 100 watts to either a Windom or a 2 element 6m Moxon I was able to make 11,941 QSO's from 40 through 6m. My last QSO today was with JE1CSW at 0013z on March 29th. I made "exactly" 1,000 QSO's on 6 meters.

I was able to work 17 new DXCC entities on this trip bringing my DXCC total up to 247 entities from Galapagos. All QSOs should be uploaded to LoTW by now.

QSL cards can be sent to my QSL MGR K8LJG. Color cards will be ordered in mid-April after I return to my NE8Z QTH. I will be back at my HC1MD/2 QTH later today, March 29th.

Here is an update that I just received. From Rick "I am now back at my HC1MD/2 QTH. I have uploaded all of my 11,668 HD8MD QSO's to LOTW. At the request of many hams, I have just created a Club Log account and OQRS has now been activated. The OQRS site is now active for direct QSL requests <u>https://clublog.org/logsearch/HD8MD</u> A colorful Galapagos Tortoise QSL is being printed and I will mail them out from my NE8Z QTH. I will be returning to Michigan on April 10th.

We have Bouvet update to share: From Ken, LA7GIA, "We have made some further adjustments as Allan EA3HSO is replacing Dave WD5COV as a Bouvet operator. Dave has to withdraw due to family reasons.

We will update our website to reflect the latest changes with the removal of the remote radios, the current Bouvet operation is thus planned with only local radios. Our four men support team together with the four crew members will be assisting us setting up and running the camp. This will add operating time for the 3 operators that will seek to have 3-5 radios running simultaneously. We still plan for a 2nd QTH dedicated to running NA stations, this QTH will provide better take off and will contain two stations and bands 40-10m and this will also give us antenna separation to run in band. The main QTH is still a good QTH for 160/80 to North America. Our setup is simple yet powerful enough to achieve a good result, similar to other trips we have conducted. With the sponsored lightweight 1500 W RF Kit amplifiers we will have enough power on all modes.

The team have self-funded \$280,000 of the trip but we still need \$75,000 to go to Bouvet to finance the entire \$400,000+ budget. We're seeking further donations to reduce the risk involved for the small 3 men team. A final decision will be made in late April depending on the funds we have raised at that time, and we're still considering other options. If you want to see 3Y0K Bouvet activated for up to 21 days, please consider making a donation in April."

I think this is important for someone who is trying to move up the DXCC ladder since entities that are on the rarer side and easiest to work in contests. Some of my best "catches" have been on the Sunday afternoon of a contest when the rarer entities are begging for QSOs. Of course, the gamble is that if you wait until Sunday, conditions may change, or they simply won't be workable. However, it is not a bad gamble. Of course, why not work the contest and have some fun!

Check out the WA7BNM Contest Calendar page (<u>https://www.contestcalendar.com/</u>) for more contests or more details.

The contests in red are those that I plan to spend some significant participation time on. PLEASE let me know if you are working contests and how you fared.

I searched around a bit and finally joined the Mad River Contest Club (https://www.madriverradioclub.org/), or the MRCC. The areas that the MRCC covers is Ohio, Michigan, and the surrounding states. They have bi-monthly ZOOM meetings. I joined and attended my first meeting. Not to be surprised, there were some big-time contesters in attendance. I have wanted to upgrade my contesting skills and I think I have found an avenue to do that. I will keep you informed as to what I learn so I can share it!

The first contest to mention is the Japanese International CW DX Contest, or the JIDX. This contest will start at 4/13/2024 0700Z and end on 4/14/2024 at 1300Z. The bands are the standard 5 HF bands with no WARC bands included. The exchange is RST and Prefecture number for JA hams and RST and CQ Zone for all others.

I worked my first JD, Ogasawara, station years ago in this contest. The SSB version is held in the fall.

The next is the OK/OM SSB Contest. This will be held on April 13th at 1200Z to April 14th at 1200Z. The bands are the standard 5 HF bands with no WARC bands included. The exchange is RS and 3 letter county code for OK/OM hams and RS and serial number for all others.

You always need to check two things when operating in DX-hosted contests. The first is when the logs are due. Make sure that you meet the deadline! Secondly, make sure you know what frequencies in the allocated bands you are allowed to operate in.

Print an Official or Unofficial Copy of Your Amateur Radio License (By Anthony Luscre, K8ZT)

As of February 17, 2015, the **FCC no longer routinely issues paper license documents** to Amateur Radio applicants and licensees. The Commission has maintained for some time now that the official Amateur Radio license authorization is the electronic record that exists in its Universal Licensing System (ULS). The FCC will continue to provide paper license documents to all licensees who notify the Commission that they prefer to receive one. Licensees also will be able to print out an official authorization — as well as an unofficial "reference copy" — from the ULS License Manager. I've created a set of instructions on how you can request an
