"Technical Coordinator (TC)

The ARRL Technical Coordinator (TC) is a section-level official appointed by the <u>Section Manager</u> to coordinate all technical activities within the section. The Technical Coordinator reports to the Section Manager and is expected to maintain contact with other section-level appointees as appropriate to insure a unified ARRL Field Organization within the section. **Requirements:** Novice class license or higher; Full ARRL membership **Responsibilities:**

- Supervise and coordinate the work of the section's <u>Technical Specialists</u> (TS).
- Encourage amateurs in the section to share their technical achievements with others through the pages of *QST*, and at club meetings, hamfests and conventions.
- Promote technical advances and experimentation at vhf/uhf and with specialized modes and work closely with enthusiasts in these fields within the section.
- Serve as an advisor to radio clubs that sponsor training programs for obtaining amateur licenses or upgraded licenses in cooperation with the ARRL <u>Affiliated Club</u> Coordinator.
- In times of emergency or disaster, function as the coordinator for establishing an array of equipment for communications use and be available to supply technical expertise to government and relief agencies to set up emergency communications networks, in cooperation with the ARRL Section Emergency Coordinator.
- Refer amateurs in the section who need technical advice to local TS.
- Encourage clubs to develop, and TS to serve on, RFI and TVI committees in the section for the purpose of rendering technical assistance as needed.
- Be available to assist local technical program committees in arranging suitable programs for ARRL hamfests and conventions.
- Convey the views of section amateurs and TSs about the technical contents of *QST* and ARRL books to ARRL HQ. Suggestions for improvements should also be called to the attention of the ARRL HQ technical staff.
- Work with the appointed ARRL TAs (technical advisors) when called upon.
- Be available to give technical talks at club meetings, hamfests and conventions in the section."

Jeff has a good crew of "Technical Specialists" who work with him to help **YOU**, the Ohio Section members with the issues and problems (of a technical nature) you face in the successful operations of your Amateur Radio stations and activities. You can get ahold of Jeff

(Email: k8jtk@arrl.net) and I'm sure he can help with your issues, or point you in the right direction to find the answers you need.

Well, I jumped right in to that! The Ohio Section has several positions, all held by qualified people willing to help you. 
National News (from ARRL and other sources)

Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act Re-Introduced

Legislation Will Increase Communication Options During Natural Disasters

WASHINGTON – U.S. Senators Roger Wicker, R-Miss., and Richard Blumenthal, D- Conn., and Representatives August Pfluger, R-Tex., and Joe Courtney, D-Conn. announced their joint re-introduction of legislation in the Senate and House to restore the right to Amateur Radio operators to install the antennas necessary to serve their communities.

Homeowner association rules often prevent Amateur Radio operators from installing antennas at their homes even though Amateur Radio has proven to be essential in emergencies and natural disasters such as hurricanes when other means of communication fail.

"Mississippians should have access to every possible means of warning for natural disasters, including amateur radio operators. In an emergency, those warnings can mean the difference between life and death," **Senator Wicker said**. "The Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness

Act would remove unnecessary roadblocks that could help keep communities safe during emergencies like tornadoes, hurricanes, and fires."

"When disaster strikes, amateur radio operators provide vital, often life-saving information, which shouldn't be hindered by prohibitive rules or confusing approval processes. The Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act eliminates obstacles for ham radio enthusiasts, allowing them to continue their communications and serve their communities in the face of emergencies," said Senator Blumenthal.

"Natural disasters and other emergency situations that hinder our regular lines of communication are unfortunately unavoidable, which is why we must bolster our emergency preparedness by removing the barriers amateur radio operators often run into when installing antennas. Amateur radio plays a vital role in public safety by delivering critical information to people at all times. My district is home to dozens of amateur radio operators ready to volunteer in the event of an emergency, and I am proud to lead this legislation," said Congressman August Pfluger.

"As we know from recent natural disasters, amateur radio operators in Connecticut can be a critical component of disaster response and emergency management. It is in our communities' best interest that we give them the capabilities to operate at the highest level, and with the reintroduction of this bill, we've taken a strong step in that direction," **said Congressman Courtney**.

Background:

The Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act of 2025 (H.R. 1094 and S. 459) would require homeowner associations to accommodate the needs of FCC-licensed Amateur Radio operators by prohibiting the enforcement of private land use restrictions that ban, prevent, or require the approval of the installation or use of Amateur Radio station antennas. Homeowner associations have often prevented installation and use of such antennas through private land use restrictions. This has hindered voluntary training for emergency situations and blocked access to necessary communications when disaster strikes.

Among other provisions, this legislation would:

- Prohibit homeowner association rules that would prevent or ban Amateur Radio antennas:
- Specify an approval process for installing Amateur Radio antennas;
- Provide a Federal private right of action to Amateur Radio operators in disputed cases.

On behalf of America's Amateur Radio licensees, Rick Roderick, the President of The American Radio Relay League, re-confirmed the ARRL's full support for the passage of the Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act of 2025 and extended his thanks and appreciation to Senators Wicker and Blumenthal and Congressmen Pfluger and Courtney for their unflagging

leadership of the bi-partisan effort to support and protect the rights of all Amateur Radio Operators.

ARRL Student Membership

ARRL Student Membership was established to increase youth participation and long-term involvement in amateur radio. Student members can access ARRL membership benefits including the digital versions of ARRL magazines, and the extensive courses and training materials available through the ARRL Learning Center.

Please note: ARRL requires age verification for all student members. Parental/Guardian consent is required for applicants under 18 years of age. Student memberships are not eligible for add-on printed membership magazine subscriptions. Student membership benefits are subject to otherestrictions and exclusions.

Student Membership options:

- Option 1: **Full Student Membership.** Dues rate \$30 per year. This low-cost membership option is available to US Amateur Radio licensees under the age of 26 years. Applicant must be a resident of the US, its possessions, or Puerto Rico. A full member may vote in ARRL elections for Division Director, Vice Director, and Section Manager. Other restrictions and exclusions may apply.
- Option 2: **Free Student Membership.** This no-cost, Associate membership option is available to full-time students aged 21 years or younger. Applicant must be a resident of the US, its possessions, or Puerto Rico. Free Student Membership excludes access to the ARRL E-mail Forwarding Service, and Associate members may not vote in ARRL elections. Other restrictions and exclusions may apply.

It is now an FCC requirement to have an FCC FRN; active email address and active phone number before taking any exam. Please bring your FCC FRN, original license, a copy of your license (if a licensed ham), a valid photo ID and \$15.00 - Cash preferred.

Effective April 19, 2022, the FCC will charge a \$35.00 application fee for amateur radio licenses. The fee will apply to new, renewal, rule waiver, and modification applications that request a new vanity call sign. License upgrades will not have a fee applied. The fee will be per application. VE's will not collect the fees at exam sessions.

<u>AE8FP Amateur Radio Test Team</u> administers ARRL-VEC testing in the Central Ohio area. Our test dates for 2025 are as follows: Januray 18, April 12, July 19, and October 18. Time and location for these dates are 10:00am at the Westerville Fire Station #111, 400 W. Main St in Westerville, Ohio. The listed dates are co-sponsored by the Central Ohio Radio Club (CORC).



To register, you will need a NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to complete one ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Googling "NCVEC quick-form 605" and clicking on the url for a pdf of the form. Please note **the FCC requires you to provide a FRN** (FCC Registration Number). Social Security Numbers are no longer accepted. If you are new to ham radio and don't have a FRN, Google "New FRN" and follow the fcc.gov link.

If you are currently licensed, be sure to **bring a copy of your license to the exam.** The cost of the exam itself is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. Identification with your picture is also necessary, such as a driver's license. If you have any questions, please contact Scott Farnham, KO8O, at (440) 256-0320, or scottfarnham@roadrunner.com

In addition to the \$15 test fee, the FCC now charges \$35 to add you to the Amateur Radio database. The FCC will e-mail successful candidates instructions for payment directly to them. Payment must be made within 10 days of the e-mail. This charge does not apply to upgrades.





We have an update on the 2027 Peter I Island DXpedition

The Peter I DXpedition team has signed a contract with the Iceland-based ICETUGS to take them to Peter I Island in February 2027, where they intend to stay for three weeks. According to the team, "ICETUGS has an excellent track record in providing services for expeditions, cargo and fuel supplies, tugging, as well as rescue and camp setup in the Arctic and Antarctic regions. ICETUGS is the same company that will take Team Bouvet to their destination in 2026." The team will continue working on securing a helicopter contract that will accommodate two helicopters to make this a safe and reliable operation as required by the Norwegian Polar Institute (NPI). They are also scheduled to sign a contract with a leading Antarctic expedition company, Spirit of Sydney, by this summer. This company has successfully organized 80+ expeditions to the Antarctic and will be leading the Peter I expedition from a permit, safety, emergency, and evacuation point of view. Spirit of Sydney has organized several other expeditions in the Antarctic region in collaboration with ICETUGS.

"Our team wishes to use this opportunity to thank all the clubs, associations, foundations, as well as individuals who have already provided us with their support. Going to such remote places would not be possible without such generous contributions. Please consider a donation to help us offset some of our costs for the Peter I Island DX-pedition by visiting our website, where there is a PayPal link at www.3y0l.com.

DK1CE, Ulmar, received his visa for Mali and his flights are confirmed. He should be QRV from Bamako, at the TZ4AM station, by now. He will be using an Elecraft K3S and KPA-1500 and an ICOM IC-7300 with wire and Yagi antennas on 160-6M; on 5M he will use SSB and FT8. Ulmar plans to pay special attention to 160M FT8, 80M, FT8 and 6M. He expects to be there until March 4. QSOs will be uploaded to Club Log and after the DXpedition to LoTW. You can also QSL direct or via the bureau to DK1CE.

The V73WW team has safely arrived on the island with all their equipment. They scouted the area and set up the antennas. Their activity started yesterday just before 2200Z. They have been reported on 10, 12, 15, 40 CW, and 10 meters SSB.

The live log on Club Log will be available soon after internet access is established at the radio shack.

The operation should last for approximately 12 days, although times on the air may vary based on local conditions. Stay tuned to Facebook and X for the latest updates and frequency information.

QSL cards will be managed by DJ4MX, and they will use Club Log OQRS, with a direct QSL option available after the DXpedition. Free OQRS bureau service will be available at a later time. Internet access permitting, they also plan on daily LoTW uploads and Club Log Live Stream.

G7BXU, Steve, says he's on his way to 9L, Sierra Leone, this month, hoping to be on the air as 9L1BXU, holiday style in his free time, with an IC-7300, 100 watts, to a G5RV type antenna. QSL via G7BXU.

Members of the Polish DX Team, SP3CFM, SP6EQZ, SP6JIU, and SP9FIH, are scheduled to visit 4S, Sri Lanka, at the end of this month. They will operate under the callsign 4S7SPG until to March 1. Their activities will include CW, SSB, FT8, and RTTY on bands ranging from 80 to 10 meters. QSL can be sent via SP6CIK. http://4s.dxpeditions.org

The Rebel DX Group will soon be active as 5N9DTG, focusing on FT8. They will use the latest SuperFox and MSHV versions on 20, 17, 15, 12, and 10 meters to maximize QSOs, which benefits smaller stations. Print an Official or Unofficial Copy of Your Amateur Radio License

(By Anthony Luscre, K8ZT)As of February 17, 2015, the FCC no longer routinely issues paper license documents to Amateur Radio applicants and licensees. The Commission has maintained for some time now that the official Amateur Radio license authorization is the electronic record that exists in its Universal Licensing System (ULS). The FCC will continue to provide paper license documents to all licensees who notify the Commission that they prefer to receive one. Licensees also will be able to print out an official authorization — as well as an unofficial "reference copy" — from the ULS License Manager. I've created a set of instructions on how you can request an "official" printed copy of your license*
