ARRL Renews Defense of the 902-928 MHz Amateur Radio Band

<u>ARRL</u>, in a recent filing, encouraged the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to listen to industry stakeholders about the detrimental impacts that proposed changes to the 902-928 MHz band would have for current users.

The FCC is considering a petition by NextNav, Inc., a licensee in the 900-MHz Location and Monitoring Service (LMS), to reconfigure the 902-928 MHz band to obtain more spectrum for itself and replace the LMS with high-power 5G cellular and related positioning, navigation, and timing (PNT) services that would



supplement GPS. ARRL filed comments opposing NextNav's proposal in September 2024.

Read more: NextNav's proposal on ARRL News (8/15/2024) Read more: ARRL Defends 902-928 Amateur Radio Band (9/12/2024) <u>ARRL's latest filing</u> [PDF] was submitted on May 13, 2025, by the association's Washington Counsel in response to an inquiry initiated by the Commission to consider more broadly ways to improve and harden GPS. ARRL's response echoes concerns of many others and underscores the need to improve and harden the current GPS system in a manner that doesn't impact radio amateurs and other users of the 902-928 MHz band. The band supports an extraordinary number of unlicensed consumer devices used by consumers both inside and outside the United States with which radio amateurs coexist.

ARRL strongly agrees with the many parties that point out in the record of this proceeding that, in working with its sister federal agencies on this issue, one of the Commission's primary goals should be to ensure that existing services already operating in the spectrum, such as in the crowded 902-928 MHz band, should not be disrupted by complementary PNT if equal or better means are available. Many billions of unlicensed devices are in use to provide hundreds of applications and functionalities to the American public, and the number of devices and the functionalities that they provide continue to grow.

These devices coexist with amateur radio operations in the 902-928 MHz band but they as well as amateur radio operations would be displaced if a 5G-like PNT service was authorized to use this spectrum.

In the current proceeding, the FCC addresses GPS concerns holistically that also are being addressed by multiple other federal government agencies under the direction of the President. ARRL emphasized the FCC's expertise and role in making the best use of the spectrum resource.

We commend the Commission for initiating this proceeding to take a holistic approach to the problem and possible solutions thereto, rather than a piece-meal approach that might have led to systems that would unnecessarily use valuable spectrum with inferior results and take years longer to construct from scratch. The Commission is the civilian spectrum expert among the collection of agencies that are addressing this issue. We rely on the Commission to make clear the value of each megahertz of spectrum and the trade-offs in designating any particular band for the purpose of complementary PNT.

ARRL's filing is intended to emphasize the public interest in protecting amateur and others' access to the 902-928 MHz band and to highlight that other, less disruptive options are available for PNT.

ARRL will continue to defend amateur access to this and other threatened amateur allocations.

ARRL Student Membership

ARRL Student Membership was established to increase youth participation and long-term involvement in amateur radio. Student members can access ARRL membership benefits including the digital versions of ARRL magazines, and the extensive courses and training materials available through the ARRL Learning Center.

Please note: ARRL requires age verification for all student members. Parental/Guardian consent is required for applicants under 18 years of age. Student memberships are not eligible for add-on printed membership magazine subscriptions. Student membership benefits are subject to otherestrictions and exclusions.

Student Membership options:

- Option 1: Full Student Membership. Dues rate \$30 per year. This low-cost membership option is available to US Amateur Radio licensees under the age of 26 years. Applicant must be a resident of the US, its possessions, or Puerto Rico. A full member may vote in ARRL elections for Division Director, Vice Director, and Section Manager. Other restrictions and exclusions may apply.
- Option 2: Free Student Membership. This no-cost, Associate membership option is available to full-time students aged 21 years or younger. Applicant must be a resident of the US, its possessions, or Puerto Rico. Free Student Membership excludes access to the ARRL E-mail Forwarding Service, and Associate members may not vote in ARRL elections. Other restrictions and exclusions may apply.


A major aspect of any successful ARRL Field Day operation is the publicity and outreach: How can the public learn about the event if they don't know it is happening? The ARRL Public

The following information is for ALL exam sessions:

It is now an FCC requirement to have an FCC FRN; active email address and active phone number before taking any exam. Please bring your FCC FRN, original license, a copy of your license (if a licensed ham), a valid photo ID and \$15.00 - Cash preferred.

Effective April 19, 2022, the FCC will charge a \$35.00 application fee for amateur radio licenses. The fee will apply to new, renewal, rule waiver, and modification applications that request a new vanity call sign. License upgrades will not have a fee applied. The fee will be per application. *VE's <u>will not collect</u> the fees at exam sessions*.

<u>AE8FP Amateur Radio Test Team</u> administers ARRL-VEC testing in the Central Ohio area. Our test dates for 2025 are as follows: Januray 18, April 12, July 19, and October 18. Time and location for these dates are 10:00am at the Westerville Fire Station #111, 400 W. Main

St in Westerville, Ohio. The listed dates are co-sponsored by the Central Ohio Radio Club (CORC).

The tests will start at **12 noon.** Please arrive a few minutes earlier.

To register, you will need a NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to complete one ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Googling "NCVEC quick-form 605" and clicking on the url for a pdf of the form. Please note **the FCC requires you to provide a FRN** (FCC Registration Number). Social Security Numbers are no longer accepted. If you are new to ham radio and don't have a FRN, Google "New FRN" and follow the fcc.gov link.

If you are currently licensed, be sure to **bring a copy of your license to the exam.** The cost of the exam itself is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. Identification with your picture is also necessary, such as a driver's license. If you have any questions, please contact Scott Farnham, KO8O, at (440) 256-0320, or scottfarnham@roadrunner.com

In addition to the \$15 test fee, the FCC now charges \$35 to add you to the Amateur Radio database. The FCC will e-mail successful candidates instructions for payment directly to them. Payment must be made within 10 days of the e-mail. This charge does not apply to upgrades.



DX This Week – #332 Bill - AJ8B (<u>thedxmentor@gmail.com</u> / <u>www.aj8b.com</u>)

I will start off this week with a bit of international news. DK7DQ, Joachim-Friedrich Martin Josef Merz, was elected chancellor of Germany on May 6. Merz, 69, is longtime head of Germany's Christian Democratic Union. An attorney by training, he has also worked as a judge and corporate board member and has held numerous political and party roles. He succeeds Olaf Scholz as chancellor. Merz



joins several well-known licensed amateur radio operators who have become leaders of their countries, including HS1ØA, King Rama X of Thailand; JY1, King Hussein bin Talal of Jordan, and his wife, JY2, Noor al Hussein; LU1SM, Carlos Saûl Menem, former president of Argentina; VU2RG, Rajiv Gandhi, former prime minister of India; IØFCG, Francesco Cossiga, former president of Italy; and YN1AS, General Anastasio Somoza Debayle, former president of Nicaragua. Congratulations to Chancellor Merz!

Each week I try to focus on those entities that will be available in the next 7 days. There is so much data to sift through that I thought a focus on the next week might be helpful. Here is what should find QRV when you tune the bands.

DAH DIT DIT DIT DAH DAH DIT DIT DAH

This section of DX News comes from Bernie, W3UR, editor of the DailyDX, the WeeklyDX, and the How's DX column in QST. If you would like a free 2-week trial of the DailyDX, your only source of real-time DX information, just drop me a note at <u>thedxmentor@gmail.com</u>.

The recent ZS8W DXPedition to Prince Edward and Marion Island by Yuris, YL2GM, is now QRT. Yuris put 31,672 QSOs in the log and OQRS is now operational for that DXPedition. Congratulations to Yuris for a job well done! To celebrate the 77th anniversary of the State of Israel and the Israel Association of Radio Communication (IARC), special callsign prefixes 4X77 and 4Z77 will be active on the air May 10-30. Don't miss this opportunity to work a special "77" prefix and join the celebration!

C37JPE from Andorra is QRV through this month, from the Unio de Radioaficionats Andorrans club. The special call is for the Games of the Small States of Europe. The games are in Andorra May 26-31. QSL bureau or direct.

From the Ohio/Penn DX Bulletin I have the following: In the city of Reims, on May 7, 1945, at 2:41 a.m., the unconditional surrender of the German armed forces was signed, thus ending the Second World War in Europe. For this occasion, a group of OMs from Marne department will use the special callsign TM45END in May from the 7th to the 11th, 14th to the 18th, and from the 21st to the 25th. They will be active on all bands and modes.

A team from India will be operating from Agatti (AS-011), Lakshadweep Islands as VU7T from May 22 to 28, including travel dates and the CQ WPX CW Contest. They plan to be active on all HF bands using simple vertical antennas near the shore. This will be the first time for VU7 to use QO-100. The team did not receive the required permissions until recently, so they are keeping this operation straightforward. Plans include setting up two HF stations, subject to final travel and baggage confirmations. The team will collaborate with local operator VU3FFB, Fahad. Other team members include VU2JXN, Ram; VU3HPF (M0XUU), Gopan; VU2TT (A45TT), San; and VU2YYF, Sid. VU2CPL, Manoj, will provide pilot support from mainland India. It is noted that VU2TT and VU2YYF may not be able to travel due to other commitments, and they have the second rig. The equipment includes an IC705 and Juma 1000 capable of up to 400 watts, as well as an IC-705 and a 10-watt transverter with a 60 cm dish and YATT helical feed. Operations will mainly be on CW on HF and Satellite, SSB on HF and Satellite when not in the contest, and FT8 only on Satellite outside the CQ WPX CW Contest. All QSOs will be uploaded free of charge to LoTW and Club Log. For paper confirmations, Club Log's OQRS will be used, with QSLs expected to be printed in mid-July.

LA9GY (also known as JW9GY, ZK2ZE, 8P9DI, SV9/LA9GY), Morten, will be operating in northwestern Eswatini as 3DA0GY from May 22 to June 2. He

will use an IC-705, a small amplifier, and a DX Commander vertical antenna. His primary focus will be on the 10-, 15-, and 20-meter bands, with possible operations on WARC-79 bands, as well as 80 and 40 meters. Expect to hear him mostly on CW, although he plans to do some SSB. Upon his return to Norway, there may be a delay before he posts the QSOs on LoTW due to potential non-radio related holidays. He aims to respond promptly to direct QSL requests with SAE. Sending letters abroad from Norway is costly, amounting to 4 USD. For more information, please consult the price list here: https://www.posten.no/en/price-list#send-abroad

After his 2.5-day operation from ZD8GB from Ascension Island G3WIP, Gerry, will now be working in Stanley, Falkland Islands from May 10 to July 12. In his spare time, he will be QRV as VP8DPD using a FT-857D and Atas 120 mostly on 20 through 10 meters.

PJ4M by PH2M, Frank, will be May 16-29, mostly FT8 and "some" SSB, 80-10. 6M is a possibility also. QSL to his home QTH or use LoTW or Club Log OQRS.

To mark the 2025 Giro d'Italia the 108th three-week Grand Tour cycling stage race, which began in the first three days in Albania special event station ZA25GIA is QRV. The three-week event will end in Rome. The ZA25GIA callsign will be active from Tirana, Elbasani, Kruja and Shkoder from May 9 to 31. Operators will include ZA1F, ZA1EM, ZA1AM, ZA1AK, ZA5G and others. They will be active on CW, SSB and digital modes on 160 through 2 meters. https://qrz.com/db/za25gia

After his holiday style operation as FY/DL4EA from French Guyana DL4EA, Antonio, will be in Suriname as PZ5EA from May 22-26. Look for him on QO-100 and some QRP on the HF bands.

D44ZZI - Warren is QRT while D44TWO will continue to operate for another week or so with his dipole from 80-10m and Yagi on 6M. D44ZZI logged over 2,300 QSOs on 40-10m (broad band RFI interfered on 80m). Most Zones and many DXCCs are represented. Calls have been uploaded to ClubLog noting that the official log is with M0OXO for QSL management.

We thank the many OMs and YLs that sought us out during our activation of Santiago Island, Cabo Verde. We enjoyed every QSO! And, because Harald will

continue operating, there will be a few more opportunities, whether you are hunting for a New One or simply an important slot.

The celebrations begin Friday May 16th at 0800Z as the International Amateur Radio Club celebrates the 160th anniversary of the founding on the International Telecommunications Union (ITU) with special event station 4U0ITU expected to be QRV until the end of the year. QO-100 satellite ops will want to listen for ITU Secretary General KD2JTX, Doreen Bogdan-Martin to give a speech at 0800Z. HF activities will also begin at that time. They will also plan to be QRV on 6 meters. QSOs will be uploaded to LoTW. Direct requests can be sent via QRZ.com address.

The most recent DX Mentor YouTube episode is available this weekend. Jim, WB2REM, was the guest. Jim discussed the upcoming DXPedition to the Faroe Islands the first week of June as well as some of his exploits; some dangerous and some fun. Check it out!

Below is a list of upcoming contests in the "Contest Corner". I think this is important for someone who is trying to move up the DXCC ladder since entities that are on the rarer side and easiest to work in contests. Some of my best "catches" have been on the Sunday afternoon of a contest when the rarer entities are begging for QSOs. Of course, the gamble is that if you wait until Sunday, conditions may change, or they simply won't be workable. However, it is not a bad gamble. Of course,

why not work the contest and have some fun!

As I mentioned last week, th contest to get ready for is the 2025 CQ World-Wide WPX Contest. The CW portion will be held the weekend of May 24th and 25th. The objective is for amateurs worldwide to contact as many amateurs and prefixes as possible during the contest period.

Only the 1.8, 3.5, 7, 14, 21, and 28 MHz bands may be used. Observance of established band plans is strongly encouraged.

The exchange is RST report plus a progressive contact serial number starting with 001 for the first contact. Note: Multi-Two, Multi-Unlimited, and Multi-Distributed entrants use separate serial number sequences on each band.

The final score is the result of the total QSO points multiplied by the number of different prefixes worked.

I have always considered this to be the end of the contest season for me, so I like to hit it hard. Let me know if you are planning to operate this and then how you do.

Please send me an email if you need any details.

Print an Official or Unofficial Copy of Your

Amateur Radio License(*By Anthony Luscre, K8ZT*)As of February 17, 2015, the FCC no longer routinely issues paper license documents to Amateur Radio applicants and licensees. The Commission has maintained for some time now that the official Amateur Radio license authorization is the electronic record that exists in its Universal Licensing System (ULS). The FCC will continue to provide paper license documents to all licensees who notify the Commission that they prefer to receive one. Licensees also will be able to print out an official authorization — as well as an unofficial "reference copy" — from the ULS License Manager. I've created a set of instructions on how you can request an "official" printed copy of your license*
