This is a BIG Weekend coming up! Field Day. Beginning with the first ARRL Field Day in 1933, radio amateurs throughout North America have practiced setting up and operating under “other than normal” conditions. Originally most stations set up in fields, simulating taking their equipment out to a remote location to operate during times of distress. In the United States, it is typically the largest single emergency preparedness exercise in the country, with over 30,000 operators participating each year. Field Day is always the fourth full weekend of June. Because there is a “scoring” system, it has become a “contest” of sorts. Usually participation is via the local club, but rules changes beginning in the COVID era have encourage folks to even participate from their home stations. It’s still good practice since there will always be stations in “unaffected” areas to pass traffic through and to.

While I miss the participation with my own club since becoming the Ohio Section Manager, I can tell you that visiting other operations has been a real “eye opener” as to the way stations are set up and operated! If you’re a POTA operator you could pick up a lot of good ideas just looking at the station configurations that are used. Might even be worth travelling around to see what you can make work in your own operations.

It's also an opportunity for some serious Amateur Radio outreach. Since most stations are set up in public areas, have 1 or 2 members designated as the “welcome committee” to your operation. Have some printed material on Amateur Radio, the ARRL and your local club ready to pass out, and make sure EVERYTHING displays contact information so they can get in touch with you later. Every station should have a sign in sheet, ask for email address and phone number. Towards the end of July make contact with all of your visitors and invite them to find out more about Amateur Radio via your local club. Above all else: BE NICE! Don’t be too busy to give them as much of a tour of your operation as they would like. You never know where you might just spark an interest!

After Field Day, there's still a lot of Amateur Radio Action taking place in Ohio and other locales that are not too far out there that you can't reach them. Check out a Hamfest you've never been to before. Get out to a new park for a POTA activation. Visit another club's meeting. Maybe even a visit to W1AW in Newington! Get out there and have Fun. Don't forget the Ohio Section Newsletter Contest will have the winners announced and plaques awarded at the Columbus Hamfest.

Everyone knows I'm an avid supporter of the Youth DX Adventure program. This year they'll be traveling to Curacao. I know they'll all have the time of their lives, but why don't you get on the air and pass out a few Q's to them? That's what they're there for – let them know the Ohio Section supports them! (I know a couple of them are Ohio Section Hams) Interestingly, Geoff Howard – W0CG, and many of the other members of the Caribbean Contesting Consortium are also all from the Ohio Section and their support makes this all possible. Please – give them your support in whatever way you can!

Finally, I believe that it is going to stop raining and warm up pretty soon. Summer will be here and that means it's antenna season! Get out there and try some different things. Improving your antenna system is one of the most cost effective ways to boost your signal. Much antenna work also involves a certain amount of DANGER – especially if you are climbing. Please, be safe, talk to the folks who have the experience and follow their advice.

ARRL Teachers Institute – Multiplying the Message

ARRL welcomed the year's first cohort of educators to attend a session of the [ARRL Teachers Institute on Wireless Technology](#) (TI) at headquarters this week. The group follows on the success of the Louisiana-based session last week, and one on Staten Island in New York City this past in January.



The educators traveled from all over the country to attend and learn how to take radio and wireless technology back into the classroom as part of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) lessons. Many of the teachers took and passed their amateur radio license exams during the week, including Professor Charnell Long, Ph.D. She is a professor at North Carolina A&T University who works with pre-service educators to become certified teachers. She hopes to be a multiplying force for the information.

“It was fun to me,” said Long. “It is an opportunity to deep dive into radio in ways I never have before.” She will incorporate the hands-on training into her courses at the university. Long learned about the program when ARRL Education and Learning Manager Steve Goodgame, K5ATA, [exhibited TI at the National Science Teachers Association convention](#).

“I see value in bringing [my students] scientific skills,” said Long. Goodgame is encouraged by the reach just one participant in TI could have. “We’re always excited to get educators hands-on with radio, but especially those who take what they learn here and go back and teach it to other educators,” he said.

Professor Long is one microcosm of ARRL’s focus on multiplying the reach of TI’s impact. The ARRL Board of Directors voted unanimously in July 2024 to authorize taking the high-quality education of TI to communities around the country. Increasing the number of teachers and therefore students reached by the training is one peg in the mission to inspire the next generation of radio amateurs.

While Professor Long and the other newly-minted radio amateurs in the cohort wait for their call signs to be issued, they continue to get hands-on with radio. Thursday’s session was focused on software-defined radios. “To see these educators have fun learning new things is a real boost, not only to the ARRL Education and Learning Department, but the future of ham radio as well,” said Goodgame.

Student Membership options:


- Option 1: **Full Student Membership.** Dues rate \$30 per year. This low-cost membership option is available to US Amateur Radio licensees under the age of 26 years. Applicant must be a resident of the US, its possessions, or Puerto Rico. A full member may vote in ARRL elections for Division Director, Vice Director, and Section Manager. Other restrictions and exclusions may apply.
- Option 2: **Free Student Membership.** This no-cost, Associate membership option is available to full-time students aged 21 years or younger. Applicant must be a resident of the US, its possessions, or Puerto Rico. Free Student Membership excludes access to the ARRL E-mail Forwarding Service, and Associate members may not vote in ARRL elections. Other restrictions and exclusions may apply.

Humanity's Return to the Lunar Surface



Using high-intensity lighting and low-fidelity mock-ups of a lunar lander, lunar surface, and lunar rocks, NASA engineers are simulating the Moon's environment to study and experience the extreme lighting environment at the lunar South Pole.

Data and analysis from testing at the agency's Flat Floor Facility at NASA's Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville, Alabama, are improving models Artemis astronauts will use in preparation for lander and surface operations on the Moon during Artemis III.

Through the Artemis campaign, NASA will send astronauts to explore the Moon for scientific discovery, economic benefits, and to build the foundation for the first crewed missions to Mars—for the benefit of all.

Axiom Mission 4 Launch Update

NASA, Axiom Space, and SpaceX are now targeting no earlier than Sunday, June 22, for the launch of Axiom Mission 4, the fourth private astronaut mission to the International Space Station. Peggy Whitson, former NASA astronaut and director of human spaceflight at Axiom Space, will command the commercial mission. Live launch coverage will stream on NASA+.

VE Sessions

The following information is for ALL exam sessions:

It is now an FCC requirement to have an FCC FRN; active email address and active phone number before taking any exam. Please bring your FCC FRN, original license, a copy of your license (if a licensed ham), a valid photo ID and \$15.00 - Cash preferred.

Effective April 19, 2022, the FCC will charge a \$35.00 application fee for amateur radio licenses. The fee will apply to new, renewal, rule waiver, and modification applications that request a new vanity call sign. License upgrades will not have a fee applied. The fee will be per application. *VE's will not collect the fees at exam sessions.*

AE8FP Amateur Radio Test Team administers ARRL-VEC testing in the Central Ohio area. Our test dates for 2025 are as follows: January 18, April 12, July 19, and October 18. Time and location for these dates are 10:00am at the Westerville Fire Station #111, 400 W. Main St in Westerville, Ohio. The listed dates are co-sponsored by the Central Ohio Radio Club (CORC).

To register, you will need a NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to complete one ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Googling “NCVEC quick-form 605” and clicking on the url for a pdf of the form. Please note **the FCC requires you to provide a FRN** (FCC Registration Number). Social Security Numbers are no longer accepted. If you are new to ham radio and don’t have a FRN, Google “New FRN” and follow the fcc.gov link.

If you are currently licensed, be sure to **bring a copy of your license to the exam**. The cost of the exam itself is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. Identification with your picture is also necessary, such as a driver’s license. If you have any questions, please contact Scott Farnham, KO8O, at (440) 256-0320, or scottfarnham@roadrunner.com

In addition to the \$15 test fee, the FCC now charges \$35 to add you to the Amateur Radio database. The FCC will e-mail successful candidates instructions for payment directly to them. Payment must be made within 10 days of the e-mail. This charge does not apply to upgrades.

"The 3Y0K team has received a major \$20,000 grant from INDEXA which is their largest grant ever. This grant is important for the team as we prepare for the next few month's activities.



We are preparing for packing the container that will be shipped from Oslo in early October. Our next vessel deposit in the order of \$400,000 is also due in two months' time.

W5JON, John, is QRV as V47JA from St. Kitts and Nevis, located 300 feet from the Caribbean Sea, until June 24, 2025. He is QRV on 160-6 meters, focusing on FT8 and SSB, especially 50 MHz. John is using a Yaesu FTdx3000 and an Elecraft KPA500 Amplifier with a Mosley MP-32N (20, 15, and 10 meters) Beam, a 33-foot vertical (80-10), and a Yagi on 6 meters. QSL direct or via LoTW.

ZL1RS, Bob, using YJ0RS is QRV until June 28th from Efate, OC-035, primarily on 6M FT8. He plans some 10M operation if and when 6M isn't open. Each moonrise and moonset he will be doing 6M EME for about an hour each time. QSL through LoTW or ClubLog or to his home QTH in New Zealand.

Nobby, G0VJG, is QRV from Bora Bora (OC-067), French Polynesia as FO/G0VJG until June 11-26, 2025. He will be using high power with beam on HF bands and 6m.

R9LR, Vladimir, will be in Uzbekistan from June 25 to July 1. He's taking an SG-Labs 2-watt rig and plans to be QRV on SSB, CW and Digital modes as UK/R9LR. QSOs will be uploaded to LoTW and Club Log. You can also QSL to his CBA.

OHIO'S



It's said that time keeps marching on. It seems we just turned the calendar page to June and it is already over half way over. With the turn of that page, most clubs and individuals put Hamvention memories and participation in Memorial Day activities behind them and set their sights for club picnics, special events, , vacation travels, POTA activations and Field Day.



Of course the largest single amateur radio operating event is breathing down our neck. Any ham not knowing that being Field Day must be living under a rock. Regardless of band and weather conditions on June 28-29 thousands of signals will fill the airwaves from all kinds of locations using all kinds of equipment. Some stations will be manned by long experienced operators using stations they designed and built themselves who will be on the air for hours pursuing that last contact. Others will be from a “newbie” who is making his/her

first HF contact at a club location. New ham operators are very noticeable on the air and should you run across one, slow down your operating to a level they are comfortable with and take a few extra moments to welcome them.

I always find it interesting where some Field Day operations are located. Although most are from common locations, there are some that are “off the wall”. Years back a club in the region decided to operate from a hilltop clearing. However when they arrived to start the set-up they discovered the location was overrun by copperheads. They persisted but no one went barefooted or without a flashlight during the night. What sleep they got was in their vehicles and not in sleeping bags near the campfire. This year the **Queen City Emergency Net** will operate from the radio room at Red Cross Building on Dana Avenue in Cincinnati while the radio room at the Athens Red Cross will be the site for the **Athens County ARA** in Athens. Some clubs use Field Day to activate the radio rooms at government facilities like the **Tri-State ARA** who plans to operate from the fire academy in Huntington or the **Greater Mason County ARA** from the Mason County (KY) EMA Office in Maysville. Others like the **Highland ARA** will set up at the edge of Hillsboro's historic district at the historic Scott House on West Main Street. Public parks seem to be very popular locations. We find the **Cambridge ARA** returning to Bloomfield's Highland Township Grove Park near New Concord, while on the far western side of the South 40 Region the **OH-KY-IN ARS** will operate from the Mitchell Memorial Forest at Cleves. The

Mason County (WV) ARA will operate from the Youth Center at Harmon Park in Point Pleasant and the **Parkersburg ARK** will find itself at the Fort Borman Park. The **Portsmouth RC** will operate from the Harrison Freewill Baptist Church near Minford. **Friends of N8BAP** has invited folks to join them at his Paint Creek State Park campsite. Another using a state park campsite location is the **Vinton County ARA** who will be at Lake Alma. Often a ham will invite their club or group of friends to operate from their QTH or property. Such is the case in Clinton County where the **Clinton County ARA** will operate from the KC2VFX QTH near Wilmington. Lancaster's Ally Park will be the site for the **All Things ARC** Field Day activity. The **DeForest ARC** will operate from 21309 SR 125 at Blue Creek and the **Milford ARC** will transmit from 1546 SR 131 near Milford. Ashland, KY's **River Cities ARA** has reserved Shelter 8 at the Armco Park. I also understand the **Monroe County EMA** will operate W8VYR during the weekend. The **Warren County ARA** will hold their Field Day and Summer Party at the Rock School House, 1026 SR 123, Lebanon. The Sacket-Wright Park in Bellbrook will be the operation site for the **Bellbrook ARC**. Check out the ARRL's Field Day locator to find a club and their location near you.

Nebraska had the most contacts with 5,951 and Ohio and Indiana jockeyed for second position. However once the smoke cleared, Ohio took the honor with 5,224 contacts.

The **Hocking Valley ARC** held another of their popular Fox Hunts on Saturday, June 14. It took Kirk Groeneveld, KC8JRV, one hour twenty minutes to find the fox with all hunters locating it within 90 minutes. Another hunt will be held in July.

Print an Official or Unofficial Copy of Your Amateur Radio License (By Anthony Luscre, K8ZT) As of February 17, 2015, the **FCC no longer routinely issues paper license documents** to Amateur Radio applicants and licensees. The Commission has maintained for some time now that the official Amateur Radio license authorization is the electronic record that exists in its Universal Licensing System (ULS). The FCC will continue to provide paper license documents to all licensees who notify the Commission that they prefer to receive one. Licensees also will be able to print out an official authorization — as well as an unofficial “reference copy” — from the ULS License Manager. I’ve created a set of instructions on how you can request an “official” printed copy of your license*
