

Important VEC Submission Updates – Effective November 1, 2025

Dear ARRL Volunteer Examiner,

To improve efficiency and security in processing exam session results, the ARRL VEC will be implementing the following changes:

Business Reply Mail Account Closure

Effective November 1, 2025, we will be closing our Business Reply Mail account with the U.S. Postal Service. As a result, we will no longer accept VEC postage-paid return labels or envelopes associated with this account.

Transition to Secure Digital Uploads

All exam session results must be submitted via our secure Session Upload page.

• If your team already uploads session documents, no further action is needed.

• If your team **has not yet transitioned** to digital uploads, please contact us at <u>VEC@arrl.org</u> to receive instructions and access to the upload portal.

Mailing Exam Fees

Teams that choose to mail exam fee checks to the VEC may **retain a portion of the collected fees** to help offset postage costs.

Checks should be sent using a standard business-sized envelope and must include a reference to the session date and location.

Reminder: ARRL VEC is Going Digital in 2025

Beginning in 2025, the ARRL VEC will transition to a fully digital program. Printed booklets and supply shipments will be discontinued as all VE teams shift to using the ExamTools system for administering amateur radio exams, either online or in print format.

VE teams can go completely electronic by using to conduct online exams for in-person or remote video-supervised sessions. Alternately, teams may print exams for in-person sessions directly from this web-based platform.

Teams that have not yet made the transition can find information on the ARRL website: www.arrl.org/volunteer-examiners, or can contact the VEC office at VEC@arrl.org for support, instructions, and guidance.

These updates are designed to streamline our processes, enhance security, and support teams during the transition.

Gear Packed for 3YØK DXpedition to Bouvet in February 2026

The 3YØK DXpedition to Bouvet Island has packed its shipping container of gear. The team spent the weekend near Oslo, Norway, getting things ready, including generators, tents, tools,

and — most importantly — radios, antennas, and amplifiers. This checks off another large box on the to-do list before they depart in February of next year.

This international team of radio amateurs is aiming to activate the #10 most-wanted DX entity, Bouvet Island, in February 2026. With 24 operators, two camps, and a load of gear, they hope to provide a lot of QSOs to those who need the entity for their DXCC totals. Bouvet is in the South Atlantic Ocean, 1600 miles from Cape Town, South Africa, and 1000 miles north of continental Antarctica.

ARRL Education and Learning Support Specialist Max Freedman, N4ML, is part of the team. At 21 years of age, he will be the youngest person to ever set foot on the island, and is the youngest operator known in a top-10 DXpedition. He is excited for the opportunity. "I have learned a lot being a part of the 3YØK team," said Freedman. "A lot of work goes into a DXpedition, more than most people think. It is an honor to work with these high performing ham radio operators to get everything prepared for February."

Student Membership options:


- Option 1: **Full Student Membership.** Dues rate \$30 per year. This low-cost membership option is available to US Amateur Radio licensees under the age of 26 years. Applicant must be a resident of the US, its possessions, or Puerto Rico. A full member may vote in ARRL elections for Division Director, Vice Director, and Section Manager. Other restrictions and exclusions may apply.
- Option 2: **Free Student Membership.** This no-cost, Associate membership option is available to full-time students aged 21 years or younger. Applicant must be a resident of the US, its possessions, or Puerto Rico. Free Student Membership excludes access to the ARRL E-mail Forwarding Service, and Associate members may not vote in ARRL elections. Other restrictions and exclusions may apply.

More NASA News:

Potential Sign of Ancient Life



A sample collected by NASA's Perseverance Mars rover from an ancient dry riverbed in Jezero Crater could preserve evidence of ancient microbial life. Taken from a rock named "Cheyava Falls" last year, the sample, called "Sapphire Canyon," contains potential biosignatures—a substance or structure that might have a biological origin—according to a paper published Wednesday in the journal *Nature*.

"This finding is the direct result of NASA's effort to strategically plan, develop, and execute a mission able to deliver exactly this type of science—the identification of a potential biosignature on Mars," said Nicky Fox, associate administrator, Science Mission Directorate at NASA Headquarters in Washington. "With the publication of this peer-reviewed result, NASA makes this data available to the wider science community for further study to confirm or refute its biological potential."

The rover's science instruments found that the formation's sedimentary rocks are composed of clay and silt, which, on Earth, are excellent preservers of past microbial life. They also are rich in organic carbon, sulfur, oxidized iron (rust), and phosphorous.

The following information is for ALL exam sessions:

It is now an FCC requirement to have an FCC FRN; active email address and active phone number before taking any exam. Please bring your FCC FRN, original license, a copy of your license (if a licensed ham), a valid photo ID and \$15.00 - Cash preferred.

Effective April 19, 2022, the FCC will charge a \$35.00 application fee for amateur radio licenses. The fee will apply to new, renewal, rule waiver, and modification applications that request a new vanity call sign. License upgrades will not have a fee applied. The fee will be per application. VE's will not collect the fees at exam sessions.

AE8FP Amateur Radio Test Team administers ARRL-VEC testing in the Central Ohio area. Our test dates for 2025 are as follows: Januray 18, April 12, July 19, and October 18. Time and location for these dates are 10:00am at the Westerville Fire Station #111, 400 W. Main St in Westerville, Ohio. The listed dates are co-sponsored by the Central Ohio Radio Club (CORC).

We have recently acquired a large amount of equipment from a local ham's estate. As a result, our operating room is undergoing a rather extensive upgrade!





To register, you will need a NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to complete one ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Googling "NCVEC quick-form 605" and clicking on the url for a pdf of the form. Please note **the** FCC requires you to provide a FRN (FCC Registration Number). Social Security Numbers

are no longer accepted. If you are new to ham radio and don't have a FRN, Google "New FRN" and follow the fcc.gov link.

If you are currently licensed, be sure to **bring a copy of your license to the exam.** The cost of the exam itself is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. Identification with your picture is also necessary, such as a driver's license. If you have any questions, please contact Scott Farnham, KO8O, at (440) 256-0320, or scottfarnham@roadrunner.com

In addition to the \$15 test fee, the FCC now charges \$35 to add you to the Amateur Radio database. The FCC will e-mail successful candidates instructions for payment directly to them. Payment must be made within 10 days of the e-mail. This charge does not apply to upgrades.

SOLOMON ISLANDS, H4. Bernhard, DL2GAC, will be QRV as H44MS from Malaita Island, IOTA OC-047, from September 20 to November 25, and then January 25, 2026, to April 10, 2026. Activity will be on 80 to 6 meters using SSB and FT8. QSL to home call.

Welcome to another episode of DX This Week! Now is the time for antenna projects – checking coax, guy wires, radials, and tape jobs. Also, take a look to see if you have room for another dipole, either for a new band, or in another direction. Let me know what you might be up to. I am about to put up my hex beam again. Yes, again. About 2 weeks after a large



tree limb crashed through it and I had repaired it and put it up; it happened again! I need to finish that and get my 2 meter beam up so I can chat with K8ST and W8ASA.

I received the cards below. V51F from Namibia, 3B9DJ from Rodriguez Island, SU1OK from Egypt and TX9A from the Austral Islands. What did you get?



DAH DIT DIT DAH DAH DIT DIT DAH

The DX word for this week is Grayline. I use this term weekly, but I am not sure that everyone knows what it is. The **grayline** (also known as the **terminator** in radio communications) refers to the band around the Earth that separates daylight from darkness—essentially the transition zone between night and day. This region is significant in **HF** (**high-frequency**) radio propagation because it offers enhanced conditions for long-distance communication.

Why is the grayline important?

- Improved signal propagation: During sunrise and sunset, the ionosphere undergoes rapid changes. The D-layer (which absorbs HF signals) weakens, while the F-layer (which reflects HF signals) remains active, allowing signals to travel farther.
- **DXing (long-distance communication)**: Amateur radio operators often take advantage of grayline propagation to make contacts with distant stations that would otherwise be unreachable.

How it works:

- As the sun rises or sets, the ionospheric layers change in density and composition.
- Signals transmitted along the grayline path can reflect more efficiently off the ionosphere.
- This effect is most pronounced for stations located along the same grayline path.

If you are interested, there is a DX Workshop in Bowling Green, KY on Saturday, October 4th. The sessions will cover DX Basics & Overview,, DX Operating Techniques, and RF Propagation. Each week I try to focus on those entities that will be available in the next 7 days. There is so much data to sift through that I thought a focus on the next week might be helpful. Here is what you should find QRV when you tune the bands.

The CYOS DXpedition team is pleased to announce the official dates for the Sable Island DXpedition. The dates are March 19-30/31, 2026. Our team would like to thank Mathieu D'Astous, the Parks Canada - Sable Island manager for working with our team and approving these dates. In the last few weeks, preparations have ramped up for the DXpedition. The Yagi antennas for 10-20 meters have been

cleaned, assembled and tested. They are now safely stored in their respective ski bags. Work is ongoing with the Spider Poles and the low band antennas. Work should be completed with those antennas in October. As we have done in the past, we will personally transport all of the gear to Halifax, Nova Scotia shortly before the DXpedition. We have been informed by Sable Aviation that the cost of the flights to the island have significantly increased since 2023. Fund raising has now officially begun for the CY0S DXpedition. Donations of any amount can be made through our website at: CY0S.com

The following update is from the V6D team, who will be QRV from Chuuk, Micronesia from September 22 to October 6.

We are currently in the final stages of distributing luggage to team members throughout Germany. Our well-organized, "light" DXpedition to Micronesia begins in 10 days. Our group is flying from Berlin via Helsinki, Tokyo and Guam to Chuuk. All members have received their ESTA authorization, which is required for entry into Guam.

We are very pleased to have received support for the DXpedition from Elecraft. We will now mainly use the excellent K4 transceivers as our station transceivers. Apart from the support for the DXpedition, several team members have invested heavily in upgrading their equipment. Most of the extensive technical equipment is privately owned by the team members.

This time, we are bringing one of the flexible 18 m long Spiderbeam fiberglass masts for the 80 m and 160 m antennas. We will therefore switch between 80 m and 160 m at night. The remaining low-band antennas will be implemented with robust 12 m and 14 m long fiberglass poles from Spiderbeam for wire loops and verticals. The 6 m antenna will also be mounted on one of these masts.

The high-band antenna (20 m to 10 m) is our full-size 2-element wire antenna LZAW10-5 from LZ ANTENNA. With the LBS Pentaplexer, we can operate 3 to 4 high bands simultaneously with up to 400 watts.

As you know, we always try to provide attractive QSL cards. We aim to print these within four weeks after the expedition. We expect to start QSL traffic sometimes in November. Requests via OQRS are preferred, with paid direct cards being processed first. Free bureau cards can also be requested via QQRS. However, these requests will be processed after the direct applications. Of course, we also use LoTW. Direct LoTW requests will be processed immediately, the complete log

will be uploaded to LOTW 6 months after the DXPedition. Hams who donate 10 USD or € will automatically publish on our homepage and receive their QSL as soon as the cards are printed.

All team members are looking forward to the DXpedition and to bringing you many QSOs on all bands and modes. See you on the bands!

DK3RN, Peter, will be in Kyrgyzstan until September 29, visiting a technical university for a cooperation project. He plans to operate EX/DK3RN mostly CW and possibly SSB on 20m and 15m, not FT8. Split operation will be used to manage pileups. On Friday, September 26, he will operate portable from mountains near Bishkek, weather permitting. Other days, activities depend on local conditions.

The Saudi Amateur Radio Society (SARS) announces in celebration of the 95th observance of Saudi National Day special event stations HZ95ND, 7Z95ND and 8Z95ND is QRV until September 23.

Iraq, YI9WPZ, operated by IZ5WPX will finish, he says, "around the end of November." Tony says he has 500 watts to a wire antenna on HF, SSB. QSL via IZ5WTV, with details on his QRZ.com page. It appears Club Log and LoTW will also work for him.

JA1ZLO/JD1 will be QRV from Ogasawara until 9-24. The stations will be an FT-891, IC-705 and IC-9700, 50 WATTS, to a wire dipole on a "fishing rod" support, covering HF, 2M and 432 MHz, phone, CW and FT8. Confirmation will be through Club Log, and they are working on setting up Logbook of the World. They are a University of Tokyo Amateur Radio Club group.

FP5KE is QRV until September 26 from St. Pierre and Miquelon Islands. They have been very active, appearing all over the bands.

A "holiday style activity" is QRV from T32, Eastern Kiribati, for "roughly two weeks," on 80, 40, 20, 15, 12 and 10M, SSB only. T32K/p will mean it's portable from one of the tiny islets, like Cook, Wood, or

Arthur. All are IOTA OC-024. The operator of T32K is VK4MAP, Darren. He says he has his usual QSL policy, direct to VK4MAP, 4 USD and SAE for international; Australians, an SASE will suffice.

WE9G/KH2, Rikk has been QRV from Guam going to September 26, planning to do some SO2R operating, mostly digital, "with some SSB and CW," 160-6. He will be working on a QSL card, which will be direct or bureau to WE9G, or Club Log OQRS. He prefers traditional paper QSL cards. SASEs or USD to cover his cost are appreciated but not required. Likewise, any PayPal donations by email to him. He answers all cards in this priority order: First, cards received with "PSE QSL," next PayPal or OQRS direct requests with donations, and after that the same but without donations. Fourth is bureau requests, fifth bureau cards that say "PSE QSL," and last email requests for a card. He plans to upload all his logs to LoTW, QRZ and Club Log, no charge from him for confirmations. Email him if you need to note a correction in your QSO info.

Recently active as VK2/SP9FIH on Lord Howe, Janusz should be QRV by now, from Christmas Island, VK9/SP9FIH. That stop goes to October 3. He notes that in Australia SSB is permitted on 30M, which is why he has listed that frequency for SSB. On FT8 he will be multi-channel F/H or SuperFox. He will have an online log on Club Log. OQRS direct requests will upload to LoTW within a few days, bureau requests answered in about a year and paper QSLs when he's home in Poland. He is seeking sponsors. https://vk9.dxpeditions.org/

Print an Official or Unofficial Copy of Your

Amateur Radio License(By Anthony Luscre, K8ZT)As of February 17, 2015, the FCC no longer routinely issues paper license documents to Amateur Radio applicants and licensees. The Commission has maintained for some time now that the official Amateur Radio license authorization is the electronic record that exists in its Universal Licensing System (ULS). The FCC will continue to provide paper license documents to all licensees who notify the Commission that they prefer to receive one.

Licensees also will be able to print out an official authorization — as well as an unofficial "reference copy" — from the ULS License Manager. I've created a set of instructions on how you can request an "official" printed copy of your license*
