

I am hopeful that everyone receiving this message will consider renewing their membership. There are so many examples of advantages to being a member of OH-KY-IN A.R.S. To name just a few, the club has a definitive flag-ship repeater, 146.670. With our son living in Louisville, and our daughter at U of L, we travel often. I can tell you that 146.670 has tremendous coverage, and the upgrades made over the last several years have really made .67 the top choice for so many hams in the area. 

What the Heck is an Antipode?

Did you ever wonder where you would come out if you dug a hole straight through the center of the Earth from Cincinnati? That point is called the antipode. Most people, having heard of “China Syndrome,” think that you would exit in China, but that doesn’t actually make sense — China is in the Northern Hemisphere, like we are, and a path through the center of the Earth would obviously have to end below the Equator. For Cincinnati, the antipode is located in the Indian Ocean, about 1,200 miles west of the southwestern corner of Australia (in the area of the yellow marker). Since the circumference of the Earth is about 24,900 miles, the distance to the antipode is half of that, or about 12,450 miles.

There are no significant islands in the antipodal area so on populated dry land, the farthest point that you can go from Cincinnati is south of Perth on the western coast of Australia. In southwestern Australia, the maximum distance is about 11,250 miles from here, near the purple marker which is Augusta, Western Australia — the closest city to the antipode. Perth, somewhat north of Augusta, is the most distant major city from us and is in the rarefied category of more than 11,000 miles away.



From a ham radio standpoint, that is VK6 territory. With the greatly-improved long-distance propagation that we are now experiencing near the peak of sunspot Cycle 25, contacts in that area are very feasible, even for those who have limited HF stations. I am one of those limited people and I have several contacts within 100 miles of the 11,250-mile theoretical maximum QSO distance. Last week (as I am writing this in September, 2025), I made my longest 40 meter contact ever, more than 11,200 miles on FT8 to a VK6 near the purple marker.

If you work HF, check to find your most distant contact (start by searching your log for VK6’s, then expand the search if those are absent). The longest will probably be in Australia, if you have any QSO’s there, since most Australian contacts are over 9,000 miles and there are few other populated areas that far away from here. Now that you know what an antipode is, you can impress your friends with your knowledge of geography, the falsity of ending up in China, and, hopefully, the impressive length of your longest contact as well. 73!

Consider a Donation to OH-KY-IN

Did you know that OH-KY-IN ARS has been recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization? That means anyone who itemizes on their Federal return can take a charitable deduction for a contribution to OH-KY-IN, as long as it qualifies under the general rules applicable to all other charitable contributions (for example, the contribution must be in cash, or other property which the organization has agreed to accept; the value of volunteered services is not deductible). Membership dues, such as the cost of a life membership, may even be deductible; consult your own tax advisor for details if considering that. Posthumous donations by Will or by naming the organization as beneficiary of a financial account are also welcome.

Special Note for Seniors: Anyone who is over 70½ can make a donation to OH-KY-IN from their IRA and enjoy a tax benefit even if they don't itemize deductions, using what is called a QCD. Simply direct your IRA custodian to make the donation directly to OH-KY-IN (not payable to you) and the distribution will not result in any taxable income to you, even without itemizing deductions on your return. Contact your IRA custodian for the proper form to use.
