Ham Radio Operator W8GXR Goes Stealth in the Sunshine State with DIY Antenna Setup

Florida — October 2025

Scott Tengen, known on the airwaves as W8GXR, is back in Florida for another round of radio adventures, armed with his trusty Yaesu FT-710 and a new stealthy antenna setup designed to dodge the ever-watchful eyes of HOA enforcers.

This time, Scott has deployed a 66-foot Off-Center Fed (OCF) dipole antenna, cleverly camouflaged among tropical plants and supported by three poles—one of which is visible, much to the chagrin of neighborhood rulewatchers. The poles themselves are a testament to ham ingenuity, salvaged from discarded "open" signs found during a bit of strategic dumpster diving.

The antenna, built with a 9:1 balun and repurposed wire, cost less than \$30 to assemble. While the ends haven't been folded back for optimal SWR, the FT-710's internal tuner handles the 2.8:1 mismatch well enough for solid contacts across multiple bands.

Despite limited operating time and challenging solar conditions, Scott has already logged impressive contacts. On 10 meters phone, he reached Costa Rica and Martinique. Across 40, 30, and 20 meters, he made a mix of phone and digital QSOs with Israel, Venezuela, St. Vincent, Morocco, and Sardinia.

The setup is portable, stealthy, and effective—perfect for Scott's ongoing mission to operate HF under the radar. He teased a future update on his new battery system, promising more insights in the next installment of "Where is W8GXR with his FT-710?"
