ARRL Year of the Club Website Contest — Call for Submissions!

A club website can keep members informed of news and upcoming events, keep them interested between meetings and activities, teach them about ham radio skills and technology, or even make them laugh, remember, or set an operating goal — the sky's the limit! As part of ARRL's Year of the Club celebration in 2026, ARRL wants to see *your* club's website.



Enter the Club Website Contest for the chance to have your website honored in *QST*. Here are the rules and requirements:

The Club Website Contest is open to ARRL Affiliated Clubs that maintain a club website.

Submissions must include a completed [Club Website Contest Submission Form](#), which asks for information about your club and its website, as well as a 500-word statement on the purpose or goals of your website, and how the features and configuration of the website fulfill the purpose/goals. Part of the judging process will include a comparison of your statement with the website itself.

Winners will be notified in May 2026, with awards presented at Huntsville Hamfest in August 2026.

Winners will be announced in a 2026 issue of *QST*, as part of ARRL's Year of the Club celebration. The *QST* article may present material from the 500-word statements supplied in the winners' Club Website Contest Submission Form. Please note that winners may be asked to supply high-resolution files of specific website pages.

Submission Deadline: Friday, January 30, 2026, 4 p.m. Eastern time.

NOTE: Once you send your Submission Form, you may update content (text, images, data) on your website as needed, per your club's normal operation, but you may not make significant changes to the site's structure or functionality until April 1, 2026.

ARRL Student Membership

ARRL Student Membership was established to increase youth participation and long-term involvement in amateur radio. Student members can access ARRL membership benefits including the digital versions of ARRL magazines, and the extensive courses and training materials available through the ARRL Learning Center.

Please note: ARRL requires age verification for all student members. Parental/Guardian consent is required for applicants under 18 years of age. Student memberships are not eligible for add-on printed membership magazine subscriptions. Student membership benefits are subject to other restrictions and exclusions.

Student Membership options:

- **Option 1: Full Student Membership.** Dues rate \$30 per year. This low-cost membership option is available to US Amateur Radio licensees under the age of 26 years. Applicant must be a resident of the US, its possessions, or Puerto Rico. A full member may vote in ARRL elections for Division Director, Vice Director, and Section Manager. Other restrictions and exclusions may apply.
- **Option 2: Free Student Membership.** This no-cost, Associate membership option is available to full-time students aged 21 years or younger. Applicant must be a resident of the US, its possessions, or Puerto Rico. Free Student Membership excludes access to the ARRL E-mail Forwarding Service, and Associate members may not vote in ARRL elections. Other restrictions and exclusions may apply.

SKYWARN® Recognition Day On the Horizon

[SKYWARN® Recognition Day](#) acknowledges the contributions of public service volunteers who provide essential weather information as it's happening. Each year on the first Saturday in December, the day honors those volunteers who pay attention when the wind picks up or the sky turns dark. Their efforts keep their communities safer by communicating warnings to the National Weather Service.

The observance recognizes the vital public service contributions that amateur radio operators make during National Weather Service severe weather warning operations. It also strengthens the bond between amateur radio operators and the local National Weather Service forecast office.

Around the country, nearly 290,000 SKYWARN weather spotters volunteer their time. They identify severe weather that could potentially affect life and property. Spotters warn the National Weather Service of the threat of thunderstorms, tornadoes, and floods.

SKYWARN spotters complete training through a variety of formats and communicate through amateur radio. As members of their community, they're vital resources both locally and on a national basis.

If you are a [SKYWARN](#) radio operator, you can participate in SKYWARN Recognition Day by visiting a National Weather Service office or by contacting other radio operators. To learn more about becoming a SKYWARN spotter, go to skywarn.org. Use #SkywarnRecognitionDay to post on social media.

SKYWARN® Recognition Day History

The National Weather Service and ARRL created SKYWARN Recognition Day in 1999 to recognize the importance that amateur radio provides during severe weather. Many NWS offices acquire real-time weather information from amateur radio operators in the field. These operators, for example, may report the position of a tornado, the height of floodwaters, or damaging wind speeds during hurricanes. All of this information is critical to the mission of the NWS, which is to preserve life and property. The special day celebrates these contributions by amateur radio operators. VE Sessions

The following information is for ALL exam sessions:

It is now an FCC requirement to have an FCC FRN; active email address and active phone number before taking any exam. Please bring your FCC FRN, original license, a copy of your license (if a licensed ham), a valid photo ID and \$15.00 - Cash preferred.

Effective April 19, 2022, the FCC will charge a \$35.00 application fee for amateur radio licenses. The fee will apply to new, renewal, rule waiver, and modification applications that request a new vanity call sign. License upgrades will not have a fee applied. The fee will be per application. *VE's will not collect the fees at exam sessions.*

AE8FP Amateur Radio Test Team administers ARRL-VEC testing in the Central Ohio area. Our test dates for 2025 are as follows: January 18, April 12, July 19, and October 18. Time and location for these dates are 10:00am at the Westerville Fire Station #111, 400 W. Main St in Westerville, Ohio. The listed dates are co-sponsored by the Central Ohio Radio Club (CORC).

This bi-monthly schedule is the first Saturday of every even-numbered month (e.g., February being the second month, etc.). They are held at the Kirtland Library, 9267 Chillicothe Road. It is 1.7 miles south of I-90 on Route 306 (Chillicothe Rd). The library is on the left, just beyond the Marathon gas station. The tests will start at **12 noon**. Please arrive a few minutes earlier.

To register, you will need a NCVEC 605 Form, which will be available at the test. If you would like to complete one ahead of time, be sure it is the Sept 2017 version or later. You can find it by Googling “NCVEC quick-form 605” and clicking on the url for a pdf of the form. Please note **the FCC requires you to provide a FRN** (FCC Registration Number). Social Security Numbers are no longer accepted. If you are new to ham radio and don’t have a FRN, Google “New FRN” and follow the fcc.gov link.

If you are currently licensed, be sure to **bring a copy of your license to the exam**. The cost of the exam itself is \$15.00, and if you wish to pay by check, it should be made out to the ARRL/VEC. Identification with your picture is also necessary, such as a driver’s license. If you have any questions, please contact Scott Farnham, KO8O, at (440) 256-0320, or scottfarnham@roadrunner.com

In addition to the \$15 test fee, the FCC now charges \$35 to add you to the Amateur Radio database. The FCC will e-mail successful candidates instructions for payment directly to them. Payment must be made within 10 days of the e-mail. This charge does not apply to upgrades.

NAURU, C2. Phill, C21TS, is QRV until November 30. QSL via LoTW.

THE GAMBIA, C5. Lui, YT3PL, and Luc, F5RAV, will be QRV as C5R and C5LT, respectively, from October 18 to November 7. Activity will be on the HF bands using CW, SSB, FT8, and FT4. DX This Week – #350

Welcome to another episode of DX This Week! As this is edition #350, I must thank Tom, WB8LCD, for allowing me to ramble on for SEVEN YEARS! Thanks Tom.

I have so much DX info to pass along that I won't be showing the great cards I received the past two weeks or talk about the great DX that has been on at night or even a word for the week. Why so much DX? It is days before the CQWW DX SSB contest, and many folks are heading to remote and exotic destinations. Get them in the log and make it worth their while to go there!

(By the way..stay tuned for a HUGE (excess of 100 page) newsletter that you can get devoted entirely to 160M)

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Each week I try to focus on those entities that will be available in the next 7 days. There is so much data to sift through that I thought a focus on the next week might be helpful. Here is what you should find QRV when you tune the bands.

The following DX information comes from Bernie, W3UR, editor of the DailyDX, the WeeklyDX, and the How's DX column in QST. If you would like a free 2-week trial of the DailyDX, your only source of real-time DX information, just drop me a note at thedxmentor@gmail.com

Revillagigedo Islands/Socorro Island:

XE1B, Mark, is returning to Revillagigedo, and should be QRV until October 30. His mission is to meet the new Mexican naval base commander and set the conditions for an international team with remote capabilities for the future. Access to the base is severely restricted and only via a Navy battleship making supply runs from Baja, Mexico. The next trip is scheduled for an October 23 departure from Socorro and a return on October 30. Since the trip is 36 hours each way, this allows Mark a five-day window of operating.

Mark is a three-time veteran of trips to Socorro, having activated XF4 in 1999, 2011, and 2018. He has permission from the Navy and two other regulatory agencies to visit the island and operate. He has a new license for this trip; the callsign will be released when he is QRV. This is a self-funded trip using Mark's personal equipment and some equipment purchased in the United States by N1DG, Don Greenbaum. This will be a low profile, low geographic impact operation to show the base commander that a DXpedition can be conducted without a major impact on the island's mission. Use of remote operators via the NCDXF RIB technology will also be discussed. Accordingly, do not expect a Mega-DXpedition this time.

Mark's intent is to make as many ATNO contacts and lower XF4's Club Log Most Wanted rank of 24 as much as one operator can do in five days. To this end, he will bring two radios, an amplifier, and four antennas to operate SSB and FT8 simultaneously. There will be no automated FT8 QSOs. He is unsure of internet availability so there will be no live streaming of his logs. QSL after the operation using Club Log only. N1DG will handle the QSL processing. LoTW QSOs will be uploaded as OQRS requests are processed. After postage and QSL printing costs, all excess proceeds will be donated to the Northern California DX Foundation.

D2 - Angola

An international team of radio ops are celebrating the 50 years of Angola's independence with special callsign D2A. The ops are from Angola, Portugal and Spain. D2A will be on the air until approximately October 29. They say their operation also promotes Angola's cultural and natural resources to the world. They will be on Mussulo Island, 24 hours per day. Independence came on November 11, 1975. The op list is EC7R, CT1BOL, D2ACE, EC1T, EA1ACP, D2XX, T2GFW, CT7APE, CT1FFU and EA5EL.

The six D2A stations will be four IC-7300s, something for satellite, and an Elecraft. Amps will be several Expert 1.3 KW ones, and ab "HF62." Planned is CW, SSB, RTTY, FT8 and QO-100, 160- 6M.

Typically, they will be split frequency, up 1-5 on CW, up 5-15 on SSB, up 3-10 on RTTY and on FT8 it's MSHV (2 to 6 slots). QSL via EA7FTR.

The following update is from EC7R, Francisco from the D2A team.

“We are trying to be on all possible bands and modes as long as propagation allows. The 60-meter band, which has been authorized for the first time in Angola, and there was a lot of expectation from everyone. We have had to change the location of antennas several times due to interference and noise from the power grid. We will try to work and look toward the United States, but conditions are not currently favorable. We will try to be in the CQ worldwide and compete here for the African zone although it is very difficult due to the conditions.”

V2 - Antigua and Barbuda

Team Antigua will be activating V26B for CQWW SSB in the M/M category with a 9-person team. Team members are WT3Q (V26B), N3BNA (V26A), N3OC (V26OC), K3RA (V26RA), AA3R (V26FT), KC2GOW (V26AG), K3MTT (V26T), NM2O (V26OO) and N2ZN (V26XU). QSL V26B via LOTW or OQRS. The individual ops will be testing things before the contest and QSL them via QRZ.com.

VP2M - Montserrat

AA0O, Pat, is joining the VP2MPN CQ WW DX SSB Contest team of ops. When not in the contest he'll be operating with his VP2MOO callsign. He'll be there October 22-28. QSL VP2MOO via AA0O.

C5 - The Gambia

F5RAV, Luc, as C5LT and YT3PL (YU5R), Lui, as C5R will be active in The Gambia from October 18 to November 7, operating CW, SSB, and digital modes on several bands. They will also participate in the CQ Worldwide DX SSB Contest as C5R. QSL C5LT direct to F5RAV and C5R direct to YU5R.

Additionally, they are working on a humanitarian project to raise funds for new classrooms for children.

E6 - Niue Island

The Rebel DX Group continue to be QRV as E6AD. This activity will be conducted by two individuals, with a primary focus on digital modes. Occasional operations using CW and SSB will also take place, utilizing eight stations on FT8, one station on CW, and one station on SSB. They will transmit up to 16 streams concurrently on each band, utilizing different frequencies within the same band (for instance, 14.074 and 14.090, or 18.100 and 18.095, among others). If traffic is low on the F/H frequency, operations will shift to the standard FT8 frequency.

QSOs will be uploaded to Club Log, and OQRS will be available for LoTW and direct QSLs. Please note that there may be an extended waiting period for processing of direct QSLs due to logistical challenges and continual travel.

A5 - Bhutan

AB1F, Abie, has announced that the A52AA 2025 initiative has made significant progress, as the Kingdom of Bhutan has officially issued both the eVisa and the amateur radio license under the same 2023 callsign, A52AA. He is scheduled to be active from November 24 to December 5.

V8 - Brunei

Once again JO1RUR, Hajime, is heading to Gadong to operate from the V85RH station during the CQ Worldwide DX SSB Contest, October 25-26. He will be in the SOAB hi-power category. QSL via LoTW.

Special Event Station V84SRU will be active to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the International Amateur Radio Union (IARU) with activity on the air from 24 October to 26 November 2025. The operators will be active on the air every day on SSB, CW and FT8.

V7 - Marshall Islands

KX4QD, Randy, has been a little more active as V73HW with recent activity on 20, 15 and 6 meters FT8. He is usually on the air over the weekends and in the mornings during the weekdays. He enjoys both SSB and FT8 and runs 1000 watts into a log periodic and "some experimental verticals". QSL direct only to Randall Hisle, PSC 701 Box 307, APO AP 96555, United States of America.

Pacific DXpedition

DK7PE, Rudi, will embark on his third Pacific DXpedition from October 25 to November 19, 2025. His journey begins with a flight to Tokyo, then continues to Guam (KG6/AH0G), followed by stops in Palau, Micronesia (V6CW), the Marshall Islands, and potentially Kiribati (T30RK). Rudi notes that affordable HF operating locations on these islands are rare, with high accommodation costs and significant radio interference (S9 QRM) at most sites. To manage costs, he plans to operate portable or from a car at 100W output, which will allow him to set up near the sea but requires daily antenna setup and takedown-meaning his operations won't be continuous. The DXpedition will blend traditional DXing, antenna experimentation (including wire beams, VDAs, and loop antennas), and interactions with local amateur radio enthusiasts. Rudi aims to operate on the low bands and 60m CW (where permitted), making all QSOs manually with an ETM9c keyer, in the style of a classic solo DXpedition.

3Y0K DXpedition Update

The 3Y0K container is currently en route to Cape Town, with an expected arrival in late November. Our team is now fully focused on preparations for the February 1st, 2026 departure. This includes a series of planning meetings to finalize logistics and camp setup- our top priority at the moment.

Next month, we'll be making the final vessel deposit of approximately \$500,000.

By that point, our total investment in this DXpedition will exceed \$1.5 million.

PJ5/6 - St. Eustatius and Saba

The Youth PJ6Y DXpedition team have four stations on the air with a fifth station expected to be QRV later this morning. They've had some lightning and rain which has slowed them down a bit.

Here is an update: Young Operators surpass 20,000 QSOs and Counting as DXpedition Momentum Builds

The PJ6Y team has just surpassed 20,000 QSOs, marking a major milestone in their on-air operations. The young amateur radio operators are taking full advantage of excellent propagation conditions, sharpening their operating skills, and connecting with stations worldwide.

Operating around the clock, the team currently has three local and two remote stations active on the air. The on-island contingent of 14 operators is joined by approximately 30 young remote operators from around the globe — a truly international collaboration showcasing the next generation of DXers.

“We have a bit of antenna work to complete today in advance of our participation in CQWW SSB,” shared Gregg, W6IZT. “The weather has been somewhat of a challenge, with frequent showers and lightning. With heavier rains forecast from Thursday through our departure, we’re accelerating our contest preparations.”

Despite the challenging conditions, spirits remain high. “What an amazing and awesome group of future DXpedition leaders!” said Glenn, W0GJ.

6O3T began around 2130Z Monday October 20. They have been reported on FT8 on 40, 20, 17, 15 and 10 meters. Late yesterday your editor received a message from the team. "We're back on the air! Couldn't leave this adventure half done. On air now on 20m and 40m...signal's a bit noisy, but the spirit's loud and clear!" They were referring to the 2024 6O3T DXpedition failure to get on the air. "This is an Italian DXpedition with team leader Fabrizio IV3JPP, Elvira IV3FSG and Mauro IV3AZV", says IT9FTP, Giuseppe. G4BWP, Fred, noticed 6O3T was at one point operating FT8 with "12 channels, many with 2 QSOs per channel" with a max of 19 QSOs happening in one transmission. "OK if signals strong and no polar flutter" Fred adds. The 6O3T team has also slightly updated their website <https://dxexplorer.net>

HC8 - Galapagos Islands

K2IN (aka HC8M), Edgar, is now active as HD8R from San Cristobel Island, Galapagos Islands (SA-004) until Tuesday November 4. During the CQ WW DX SSB Contest HD8R will be participating. QSL via OQRS to M0OXO.

Print an Official or Unofficial Copy of Your Amateur Radio License *(By Anthony Luscre, K8ZT)* As of February 17, 2015, the FCC no longer routinely issues paper license documents to Amateur Radio applicants and licensees. The Commission has maintained for some time now that the official Amateur Radio license authorization is the electronic record that exists in its Universal Licensing System (ULS). The FCC will continue to provide paper license documents to all licensees who notify the Commission that they prefer to receive one. Licensees also will be able to print out an official authorization — as well as an unofficial “reference copy” — from the ULS License Manager. I’ve created a set of instructions on how you can request an “official” printed copy of your license*
