

Winter Field Day 2026



The last weekend of January will be here before we know it and that means Winter Field Day time! We've had a great event for several years now, using the barn at Harvest Home Park in Cheviot as our operating location for this fun operation. By using the unheated, uninsulated

barn, we qualify as an outdoor operation. The walls provide a decent wind break and the roof (mostly) keeps any precipitation off of us, but if you spend very much time there, you will definitely agree we are "outdoors" for this one.

The primary purpose is to encourage hams to practice field deployment in winter conditions. While the ARRL Field Day event in June encourages practicing field setup, not all disasters and emergencies happen in the warm summer months. Winter conditions can add different challenges not experienced in June. WFD gives us a chance to practice winter operating. Our focus is fun, learning and experimentation, with plenty of social engagement.

Although the event expanded the operating period to 30 hours, we still target the original 24 hour window. We will begin setup very approximately at 11 AM on Saturday, January 24th, start operating as soon as we are ready, then start cleanup **no later** than 2 PM on Sunday, January 25th. We particularly need volunteers to cover the overnight hours. Even if don't wish to operate, we need at least two people there throughout the night to guard the equipment. Call for Help Tower Move

Bill Gant (W8GNT) put out a groups.io message about the tower of a silent key. I responded to the new owner of the tower and we worked out a deal. I put out a call on groups.io (OHKYIN, Milford, VOA, NKARC) and got my responses from OHKYIN only. Lance, a new Tech, KF8EEM and his step-dad Bob, Mark WA6LZO visiting from Oregon, and I took the tower apart and down. No hard work, just fighting lots of rusted nuts and bolts. We had fun, got to visit, and were able to load the Rohn BX 48 tower, the 35 feet of Rohn 25G and rooftop tripod in the back of the pickup truck and it is now in my driveway.

We were very lucky with the lowering as the original 1/8 inch steel cable was rusted and parted dropping the tower and antennas 2 inches on top the ladder. This way the antennas were above the ground and able to be taken off the mast by standing on the back of the truck. We then raised it with my cable on the winch and lowered it to the ground to take the sections apart and free the rotator and thrust bearing.

The new land owner cut off the layover piece from the concrete base and I will reuse it and he gets a nice fire pit base for his yard.

The plan is to clean it, check it, then prime and paint the sections (alternatively red/white) and replace the old hardware with new. The new hardware arrived yesterday. A hole for the base needs to be dug and then filled with Quikcrete (45 bags). Going to get the base ready with prime and paint and weld on the new rebar so that it can layover our pool and concrete deck. My XYL is happy that it is self supporting as she did not want guy wires. I am not going to mention a doublet to her at this point.

On my YouTube channel 'Roscoe1024' there is a 'Radio Tower' playlist with videos of the takedown, survey, and particular parts featured. Stay tuned for more.

Thanks OHKYIN for all the help. This means a lot to me, and I am looking forward to getting up on the air on the tower.





Consider a Donation to OH-KY-IN

Did you know that OH-KY-IN ARS has been recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization? That means anyone who itemizes on their Federal return can take a charitable deduction for a contribution to OH-KY-IN, as long as it qualifies under the general rules applicable to all other charitable contributions (for example, the contribution must be in cash, or other property which the organization has agreed to accept; the value of volunteered services is not deductible). Membership dues, such as the cost of a life membership, may even be deductible; consult your own tax advisor for details if considering that. Posthumous donations by Will or by naming the organization as beneficiary of a financial account are also welcome.

Special Note for Seniors: Anyone who is over 70½ can make a donation to OH-KY-IN from their IRA and enjoy a tax benefit even if they don't itemize deductions, using what is called a QCD. Simply direct your IRA custodian to make the donation directly to OH-KY-IN (not payable to you) and the distribution will not result in any taxable income to you, even without itemizing deductions on your return. Contact your IRA custodian for the proper form to use.
